





Spain approves new law recognizing animals as 'sentient beings'

Thanks to the legislation, which was only opposed by the far-right Vox party, pets and wild species will no longer be considered as 'objects' in the Spanish Civil Code. Animals in Spain will no longer be considered as 'objects' by the law thanks to new legislation passed on Thursday by Spain's lower house, the Congress of Deputies.

From now on, animals will be treated as `sentient beings', and as such will have a different legal standing than an inanimate object. They will no longer be able to be seized, abandoned, mistreated or separated from one of their owners in the case of a divorce or separation, without having their wellbeing and protection taken into account.

The new law to modify the legal framework of animals was approved on Thursday with wide support from Spain's Congress, only the far-right Vox party voted against the measure. The legislation changes the Civil Code, Mortgage Law and Civil Procedure Law, and broadly applies to all animals, whether they are domesticated or wild.

Animals were already recognized as sentient beings, with rights and interests that must be taken into account, in European law, regional administrative laws and even Spain's Criminal Code. But this recognition was not present in the Spanish Civil Code, which covers issues relating to property, family and obligations. This meant that lawyers did not have a legal basis to address certain problems, such as what to do with pets in divorce cases. 'It's a step forward and it says that in separations and divorces, the arrangement that will be applied to the animals will take into account not only the interests of the humans, but also of the animal, explained María González Lacabex, from INTERcids, a legal organization specializing in animal protection. We are the only species that recognizes the suffering of others and as such we have an obligation to prevent that suffering The process to get the law approved has been long and winding. It was first proposed in 2017, but did not move





forward due to the upheaval caused by Spain's two general elections in April and November of 2019. It was not until April of this year that the initiative appeared before Congress, where it was supported by all parties except Vox. In September, the law was then approved by Spain's upper house, the Senate, which introduced some modifications. And on Thursday, it was given the final green light by Congress.

The conservative Popular Party (PP) largely supported the text of the document, but warned the coalition government, which is led by the Socialist Party (PSOE) and junior partner Unidas Podemos, that it will not back greater protections for animals. The warning was in reference to the Social Rights Ministry, headed by Ione Belarra from Unidas Podemos, which is preparing a draft for a new animal welfare law that includes stricter measures to prevent animal trafficking and abuse. Teresa Aguada, a lawmaker from the PP, called on the Socialists not to 'cede to the extremist pressure of your partners (Unidas Podemos) to attack our traditions. culture and rural world.' Most of Spain's congressional parties, however, welcomed the law's approval. 'It's a moral victory in a country where 200,000 animals are abandoned each year, said Juantxo López de Uralde, from Unidas Podemos. Sonia Guaita, from the PSOE, pointed out that similar legislation exists in most European countries, adding: `Those who are violent against animals are potentially violent against humans as well.' Guillermo Díaz, from the center-right Ciudadanos (Citizens), also defended the law. 'We are the only species that recognizes the suffering of others and as such we have an obligation to prevent that suffering, 'he said, explaining that up until now, 'animals were not considered different from a television' in divorce cases. The sole voice of dissent came from Vox lawmaker Ángel López Maraver, who is the former president of the Spanish Hunting Federation. He described the law as 'insanity, nonsense, stupidity. It humanizes animals and dehumanizes man.

Spain tightens travel restrictions amid concerns over omicron coronavirus variant!

Strategicfin **New Year**

Of course, you can review your financial planning any time to ensure it is on the right path, but the New Year is the perfect prompt to do so if you have not taken a fresh look for a while.

One key reason to review your wealth management is to ensure it is up to date. Establish whether any tax rules or financial regulations have changed and consider if developments in your personal circumstances mean you should adjust previous arrangements. But an effective review of your financial planning, to ensure it is suitable for your life in Spain and wishes for the future, needs to go beyond that. Many people only consider segments of their finances at a time. They may have bought shares in companies they like and/or invested in funds recommended by an adviser years ago. They may speak to a tax accountant about Spanish taxation and to a lawyer about setting up a Spanish will. At some point they look at their pension funds. For truly effective financial planning, however, you need to consider all these various aspects together. For example, how you hold your investments can make a difference to your Spanish tax liabilities. Estate planning in Spain is no simple matter, with its complex succession tax regime and forced heirship rules, and how you own assets can impact on what you can achieve. When deciding what to do with your pensions, look at all your retirement savings and what income they can generate for you. Here are three key areas to consider in your

financial planning review.

Spanish residency and taxation

The fact that you are resident in Spain, rather than the UK, has a significant impact on your financial and tax planning. Make sure you know where you are resident for tax purposes, especially if you are new to Spain or spend significant time in both countries. The Spanish and UK residency rules are different and more complex than first meets the eye. The double tax treaty determines where you pay tax if you are resident in one country and earn income in the other.

Regardless of how effective your tax planning in the UK was, you pretty much need to start afresh in Spain. What was tax efficient in the UK is unlikely to be tax efficient here. Explore the compliant arrangements available in Spain to establish what would work for your situation and aims, and how much tax vou can save.

Estate planning

Don't leave estate planning to the final stage of financial planning. The way you own assets could make a difference to how you can distribute them on death and how much tax your beneficiaries pay, so take this into consideration early on. The Spanish succession tax rules are very different to UK inheritance tax rules and you need to understand these to be able to plan around them. Succession law in Spain establishes forced heirship rules and protects children over your spouse - in general terms, children are entitled to receive two thirds of an estate's assets. This can have unwelcome consequences for certain families unless you plan ahead. UK nationals can use the EU regulation 'Brussels IV' to distribute

their estate under the appropriate UK jurisdiction's law, but research this first to confirm if it is the best solution for you.

Financial structuring for life in Spain

Perhaps the key rule for financial planning is that it must be specifically structured around your personal circumstances – your lifestyle today and plans for the future, family situation, income requirements, objectives, time horizon and risk tolerance. If you do not already have a strategic financial plan in place for Spain, you may need to take a fresh look at all your investments and consider if they are suitable for you today and the current economic climate.

Are they too risky? Do you have adequate diversification? Can they provide income without risking the capital? Could you consolidate shares and funds so they are easier to manage?

At the same time, consider your tax liabilities on investment income and gains, as well as the annual wealth tax, and whether you could use tax efficient arrangements to hold your investments as resident of Spain. And how will these savings be passed to your heirs?

What inheritance taxes will they have to pay? Can the funds be passed on directly or will there be a lengthy probate process?

longest since 1712, when there was a volcano in El Charco, also on La Palma. It is sÆll, however, way off the 2,055 days that the erupÆon of Timanfaya, on neighbouring island Lanzarote, lasted. According to the Volcanology InsÆtute of the Canaries (Involcan), the energy being released is as much as 286.2 terawal s per hour, a figure that's equivalent to 35.9 Æmes the energy needs of the enÆre Canary Islands archipelago. So much of this natural energy has served to destroy man-made construcæons on La Palma. Many residents have already lost their homes, while others are waiÆng anxiously to see if their properÆes will escape the passing of the lava. Hundreds have lost their jobs while many others may lose theirs in weeks to come. The numbers can't reflect the enÆre reality of the situaÆon, but they can help when it comes to describing the magnitude of the tragedy on what is affec Eonately known as the "Isla Bonita" (the beauÆful island).



When the volcano began to erupt, the whole world looked on with amazement at the natural spectacle. The island residents, however, were aware from the very first moment of the dangers they were facing. By the next morning, the lava had razed a large part of El Paraíso neighbourhood in the municipality of El Paso, as



well as part of Las Manchas, and was moving downhill at great speed in a southwesterly direcæon.

The volcano does what it wants, María José Blanco, a volcanologist from the NaÆonal Geographic InsÆtute, has explained on a number of occasions. On its erraÆroute, the lava has covered El Pedregal, Todoque, Los Campitos and Callejón de la Gata. In total, up to 1,041 hectares of land had been covered by the lava, that's 1.4% of the total area of La Palma, with a perimeter of 53 kilometers. The lava has also created a new delta in the sea, starÆng from September 28th, with 42.8 hectares of new territory up to now.



The widest part of the lava flow expelled from the Cumbre Vieja mountain ridge measures as much as 3,200 meters. As well as this surface area, a further 2.5 kilometers have been declared an exclusion zone by the team of experts monitoring the phenomenon, the Volcano Risk PrevenÆon Plan (Pevolca). The objecÆve is to avoid gases and pyroclasts, rock fragments produced and ejected by the volcano from affecÆng the populaÆon.

The reduced effect of the lava is clear for all to see. The explosiveness of the cone, however, is causing constant collapses, which is changing the route of the lava flows. This means that, two months later, there have been as many as 12 different routes for the molten rock, each creaÆng its own path of destrucÆon.

So far, the erupÆon has destroyed 1,184 homes according to land registry figures. Those are the dreams of 2,120 people, the number of residents in the exclusion zone according to data from La Palma Cabildo, as the island authority is known. The anxiety, however, is being felt by a total of 7,000 people, the number of residents who have had to be evacuated since September 19th, the moment everything began.

On that Sunday, the Canary Islands' regional government urgently ordered 5,000 people to abandon their homes. Five days later, a further 350 people were evacuated from Tajuya, Tacande de Abajo and Tacande de Arriba. On October 12th, another ordeal began for around 1,200 residents of La Laguna,



the neighbourhood where, King Felipe VI and Queen LeÆzia of Spain said that they were leÕ `speechless´ by what they had witnessed on a visit there.



The Canarian government has prepared two hotels and a number of other faciliæs for those who have been displaced but barely 483 residents have made use of them. The remainder of the evacuees are doing the best they can in the homes of relaæves or friends.

'We are sÆl in the thick of it,' the regional premier of the Canary Islands, Ángel Víctor Torres, has stated over and over. That is why the actual cost of the damage caused by the volcano conÆnues to rise, minute by minute.

Notwithstanding, Torres has sought to esÆmate the final bill: between €550 and €700 million. This figure would qualify the island for access to the European Union's solidarity fund: the requirement is damages above 1% of gross domesÆc product (GDP), some €430 million.

The problems, however, are not limited to people losing their homes or their businesses. Up un Al now, 66 kilometers of roads have also been damaged. Among them, one is par Cularly important: the 2.1 kilometers of the LP-2 that have been cut off by the lava. There are just 15 kilometers between Los Llanos de Aridane and Fuencaliente. AÕer the erup Con and the blockage of this route, many people are having to travel halfway across the island every day.

The third Æme the Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez travelled to the Canary Island aÕer the erupÆon began the Socialist Party (PSOE) leader announced a `powerful package of measures´ that would be desÆned for the rebuilding of infrastructure as well as the reestablishment of the water supply, investment in employment, housing, agriculture, tourism and a range of tax breaks. The total budget for these policies is €206 million, he explained.

As well as these funds, the Canarian government has allocated €40 million more in spending during this first phase, and a further €10.5 million has been approved by the central government for housing and essenÆal items. The regional execuÆve, meanwhile, will include an extraordinary item in its 2022 budget to begin the rebuilding of the island. What's more, the Cabildo has received €7.5 million in donaÆons and there is also the promise of more money from Brussels.

Earth tremors have been a regular feature of the erupÆon, but the fact that they have been so regular has not stopped the populaÆon of La Palma from suffering every Æme the ground shakes and it has shaken a great deal in the last two months. Since the erupÆon began up unÆl November 18th, there have been 5,100 tremors on the island, which is 85 a day, according to data from IGN seismologist Ithaiza Domínguez.

Of these, 547 have been below a depth of 20 kilometers. But it's not just the quanÆty that is significant, but also their virulence. Sixty nine of them have measured at least 4 on the Richter scale, and a total of 750 have been felt by the populaÆon.

National Trust to fell at least 30,000 trees hit by ash dieback!

Charity warns of 'catastrophic' increase in tree and plant disease because of climate breakdown.

Photograph: National Trust/PA At least 30,000 ash trees are due to be felled by the National Trust this year at a cost of £3m due to dieback, as the charity warns of a "catastrophic" increase in tree and plant disease because of climate breakdown.

Changing weather patterns are expected to cause pests and diseases that destroy trees to thrive, which could bring dramatic change to British landscapes.

The charity has released aerial images showing how this is already happening with some species. For example, tens of thousands of larch trees will be felled due to Phytophthora ramorum, affecting views such as Tarn Hows in the Lake District. The spread of the fungus-based pathogen is accele-rating across the Lakes and in some sites it is predicted that 75% of larch in the woodland will be lost. Foresters in the area expect 95% of their time will be spent dealing with the disease. Just this autumn, two fresh threats to plant health have been identified in the UK - a new disease, Phytophthora pluvialis, and a new outbreak of the eight-toothed spruce bark beetle has been found in south-east England, meaning restrictions have been placed on the movement of trees, bark, wood chipping and cut foliage in various parts of the country. Phytophthora pluvialis was discovered last month in an area of Cornwall, the first time the disease has been identified in Europe. The disease has since been found in Devon and Cumbria. Although it has not yet been found on National Trust land, experts are keeping a close eye on western hemlock, Douglas fir and several pine species.

The National Trust says it is trying to build "woodlands of the future" that are resilient to climate change, including using species from warmer climates, which are less likely to be affected by disease, for example, by replacing ash trees with walnut.

Ash dieback is also taking up resources, with the cost of removing diseased ash trees having risen from £1m to £3m over the past year. It is expected that 75–95% of the UK's ash trees will be lost in the next 20 to 30 years.


Scientists are also braced for an outbreak of Xylella, an incurable plant disease that can cause serious stress and death in over 150 species including oak, cherries, hollies and walnuts. It has not yet hit the UK but there have been major outbreaks elsewhere in Europe, with olive groves ravaged. It is likely that the disease will come to the UK on an imported plant, much like other pathogens that have been brought over by the horticulture trade.

The National Trust has also warned that an increase in the incidence of storms such as Arwen last week is disrupting disease management efforts and costing millions of pounds to clear up. Thousands of trees are also being lost to the extreme weather events, further adding to decimation of the UKs woodlands.

Trees lost due to disease and pests need to be replaced to help Britain meet its climate change commitments, the National Trust argues, as they are crucial in effectively sequestering carbon as well as continuing to provide homes for wildlife and public access to nature.

Lost' Sun Temple

Lost Sun Temple From 4,500 Years Ago Discovered In Egypt — Beneath A Newer One

The mud brick temple discovered in Abu Ghurab dates back to the mid 25th century BCE and is likely one of six sun temples mentioned in ancient Egypt inscriptions. The sun temple of the Egyptian pharaoh Nyuserra covered a much older one. Thousands of years ago, a great pharaoh in Egypt ordered the construction of a sun temple. But the sands of time and the political will of his successors buried it in the desert. Now, archaeologists say they've found his 'lost' sun temple hidden beneath a more recent

Archaeologists from the University of Naples L'Orientale and the Polish Academy of Sciences came across the temple in Abu Ghurab, some 12 miles south off Cairo. They suspect that the temple dates back to the mid 25th century B.C. It's likely one of six sun temples built during Egypt's Fifth Dynasty and just the third to be discovered.

The 4,500 year old temple long lay hidden in plain site beneath the temple of Nyuserra, a pharoah who ruled Egypt between 2400 and 2370 B.C. Archaeologists discovered Nyuserra's temple in 1898 but didn't realize the significance of the mud bricks beneath it. 'The archaeologists of the 19th century excavated only a very small part of this mud bricks building below the stone temple of Nyuserra and concluded that this was a previous building phase of the same temple,' explained Massimiliano Nuzzolo, the co-director of the dig. Nuzzolo, who is also an assistant professor of Egyptology at the Polish Academy of Sciences' Institute for Mediterranean and Oriental Cultures in Warsaw, has spent his career looking for Egypt's sun temples. And he's fairly sure he's found one.

'Our finds demonstrate that this was a completely different building, erected before Nyuserra', he said. He ruled Egypt for between 20 and 30 years. In the beginning, though, archaeologists

weren't as sure. Could the 19th century archaeologists have been right? Were the mud bricks connected to Nyuserra's temple and not the remains of a different

'We knew that there was something below the stone temple of Nyuserre, but we don't know if it is just another building phase of the same temple or if it is a new

temple,' Nuzzolo explained. But Nuzzolo and his team found a 'huge, monumental' entrance which he believed suggested that they'd found a separate building. 'So, why not another sun temple,' he said, 'one of the missing sun temples?' His team soon uncovered a number of clues that suggested that they had indeed found a sun temple. Significantly, they found beer jars filled with ritual mud. These pottery jars date back to the mid 25th century before Nyuserre's time and were

only used for specific rituals. I have now many proofs that what we are excavating here is one of the lost sun temples,' Nuzzolo said triumphantly. He suspects that although the original temple was impressive in size, Nyuserre had it destroyed so that he could build his own. Sun temples were a popular option for pharaohs during Egypt's Fifth Dynasty. Ra, the Egyptian sun god, is considered one of the most powerful Egyptian deities. And pharaohs sought to embody his power by building sun temples in their own names. Each king wanted a pyramid for achieving his resurrection but this was not enough for the fifth dynasty kings,' Nuzzolo explained. 'They wanted something more. The king built [a sun temple] to turn himself into a god. The sun god.' He added, 'Indirectly, therefore, the main purpose of the temple was that of being the place for the deification of the living king."

In addition to the most recent temple and Nyuserre's temple, archaeologists in the 1960s also found a sun temple honouring the pharaoh Userkaf. But to date, they aren't sure which pharaoh built the recently discovered temple.

That's just one of the many mysteries Nuzzolo and his team hope to uncover. By studying pottery they recovered at the site,

the archaeologists also seek to discover how people ate, what they believed, and how they lived.

In the meantime, the search for Egypt's other three sun temples continues. But if those temples were built with mud brick, it's possible that they slowly eroded over the centuries, leaving behind no hint of their former might.










Pine Processionary Caterpilars!

With the mild winter we are enjoying, the Costa Animal Society (CAS) would like to warn you that we can expect an early visit from the annual Pine Processionary Caterpillars in 2022. Pine Processionary Caterpillars usually start their annual march from their pine nest into underground burrows in late winter to early spring. They get their name because they undertake this journey in single file lines and follow one another much like a religious procession. The danger for your pets, and for humans, is that this is when we are most likely to come into contact with these rascals. At this stage of their lifecycle they possess an unusual defence mechanism. That is, they are covered in fine white poisonous hairs, which can cause reactions ranging from an extremely itchy rash to very deadly anaphylactic shock when they are touched or ingested. During the winter Pine Processionary

Caterpillars make nests, which resemble large cotton balls or white cotton candy, in our local pine trees. If you live near pine trees, especially ones with white nests, extreme care must be taken with your pets as the weather begins to warm in the You should not let your dog roam free and

you should try to keep your cat indoors Unfortunately, the inherently curious nature of your pet may lead them to investigate these unusual creatures. If your pet has the misfortune to sniff, lick our bite these caterpillars your animal would likely suffer a severe allergic reaction or anaphylactic shock, possibly causing airway closure and death

The symptoms of exposure to caterpillar hair are excessive drooling or frothing at the mouth, difficulty in breathing and/or white spots in the mouth or tongue. If you think your pet is suffering from these symptoms, our vet recommends you flush your animal's mouth with as much water as possible and immediately take your pet for emergency treatment. A final warning: if you are thinking of taking a pre-emptive strike against these nests you should bear in mind that they too are full of caterpillar hair, which can easily fall out when disturbed. Exposure in humans has been known to cause a severe skin irritation that can last up to three weeks, temporary blindness and/or respiratory problems. Make sure you take appropriate precautions or hire a professional.

New Year Resolutions for You AND Your Dog!

The presents are opened, the dinner is eaten and now it's time to start thinking about those New Year's resolutions. It's that time of year again when we think about what we could have maybe done differently this year and vow to do better next year.

My efforts are usually (make that almost always) a bit half-hearted. My personal resolutions have ranged from becoming fluent in Spanish (this year WILL be the one!) to keeping the office neat and organised (don't ask). I haven't decided what my resolutions for the new year will be but I'm thinking...not only about resolutions for myself but also for my dogs. Here are 10 resolutions you and your dog can work on together so you can both have your best year yet!

1. Leave your mobile phone in your pocket on walks so that you are truly present and spending time with your dog. It's the time you spend together that builds the relationship, and this is one of the easiest ways to enjoy each other's company.

2. Try a new activity with your dog. Training classes or a class in agility perhaps. We live in a beautiful part of the world with some amazing places to walk or hike – take advantage of this and explore with your dog.

3. Provide better nutrition for your dog. This is a big task for most of us, but even a few simple steps can make a difference. Try a better quality dog food, add fresh vegetables and fruit to your dog's diet and give them things like blueberries or carrots as treats instead of the usual biscuits or chews.

4. Give back to the canine community. Volunteering at a shelter or rescue, fostering a dog, or giving money to one of the many organisation in the area that work hard to improve the lives of animals.

5. Teach your dog something new. Practical training skills such as walking nicely on a leash, waiting at the door or a solid stay all pay big dividends. Other possibilities are to teach your dog a new game so you can play together more. Fetch, tug, find it, hide and seek, and chase games are all options, though depending on your dog, not every game may be a good fit.

6. Take better care of your dog's teeth. Have a chat with your vet about a dental cleaning or about brushing at home. Dental care helps improve overall health and can make your dog's breath more pleasant, too.



7. Play with your dog! Training and exercise are great, but sometimes a dog just needs some simple playtime. I know you are busy, but your dog is a social animal. Spend twenty minutes a day enjoying your dog. Let your dog enjoy you. Play fetch, or teach your dog to tug. Have fun with your dog!

8. Get your dog a food puzzle toy. This is known as "enrichment". Enrichment is providing animals with mentally and physically stimulating experiences. There are many food-dispensing toys for dogs on the market or you can use your imagination and make your own. I prefer toys that can hold an entire meal for the dog. The dog must paw, push with his nose, and otherwise move the toy around so that pieces of food or treat are released.

9. Exercise More. It's important to take some time out of your busy schedule each day to help your dog stay happy and healthy. One of the biggest risk factors for dogs is pet

obesity which can cause breathing problems, skin and coat issues, arthritis, and mobility concerns.

Take 15 minutes to get outside and go for a walk, throw a frisbee around, or play at the dog park. Daily walks provide many different health benefits for your dog. In addition, it's also extra exercise for you as well!

Our best friends mean so much to us, and if they live a long, happy, and healthy life, that's what matters most.

10. Drink more water! Just like humans, staying hydrated is

essential for your pet's health! It helps to regulate body temperature, flush waste and bacteria, and promote skin health. Remember to refresh your pet's water bowl daily and when you see your dog taking a sip, don't forget to take one yourself.







Dry January – does life without alcohol

seem unbearable?



The holiday season is almost over, fun has been had and we've all overindulged with food and alcohol. Most people will be looking at a January of moderation, a chance to get stuck into the New Year's resolutions by eating healthily, a bit of exercise and cutting back on the booze.

What if you struggle to cut back on alcohol, you realise that a dry January isn't an option you can or want to contemplate. Not drinking seems to be the worst idea in the world, and what, or where, would you get your pleasure? Deep down you know things can't carry on as they are. The consequences of your drinking are catching up with you.

The hangovers are killing you; maybe you are starting to drink earlier, or once you pick up a drink you don't know how it will end. Physically your body isn't doing well, shakes in the morning, struggling to eat properly, or other health worries that are only getting worse. Relationships are suffering, family members are commenting on your drinking, invites out with friends are drying up because it always seems to end in disaster, and when you try and control or stop the alcohol you are just angry and irritable.

There is a warning flagging in your brain, a thought that maybe you have a problem with alcohol, but another part is telling you that you can't consider not drinking anymore, that life without booze would be unbearable. This isn't true, there is an alternative, a solution that millions of people worldwide have used to combat issues with problem drinking.

Here a couple of members of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) talk about how they found an answer to their struggles with alcohol, and how their lives have turned around.

"My name is Clifford and when I came into AA, I thought my life was over. I was in debt to the tune of hundreds of euros, owed to bars, clubs, and friends. I was dirty and greasy, people didn't want me around them. My family could no longer deal with me, and I'd just lost my best friend to alcoholism. I was 25 years old, and I had no future and no hope.

In just five months my life has transformed completely. Things changed the moment I walked into my first meeting, I found a crazy bunch of people who constantly make me laugh and who will love and support me through anything. I have real friends now. My life has meaning and purpose. Whatever idea you may have of AA in your head, get rid of it because it is not what you expect at all. It is life changing and it makes me happy to be alive every single day!"

"My name is Amelia. I was driven to AA by my loneliness, depression, and self-sabotage. On the days when I was drinking, I was full of darkness, and it was slowly killing me. When I wasn't drinking it was worse, whether I was hungover or not I was always lonely and sad. I could see no way out.

I am 35 years old; it took me over 10 years to get into AA. It was suggested to me in my early 20s, but I let every excuse stop me from attending meetings. I was sure that my life would be over - little did I understand I had no life before, all I did was think about alcohol. Drinking, not drinking, planning my drinking, trying to stay sober and all the time I was so unhappy. AA has shown me a new way to live, how to manage my life. I now have hope for the future, all my relationships have improved, and my day-to-day life is easier. I am so grateful."

There are meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous, with friendly people who will understand, held daily throughout the Costa del Sol. Meetings are free to attend, and anyone who thinks they may have a problem with alcohol is welcome.

The sprawling site in Yavne, 15 miles south of Tel Aviv extends 75,000 square feet and includes five wine presses, as well as v

Some 1,500 years ago, the wine factory was the largest in the world. 'The wine was taken to many, many countries around the Mediterranean,' explained Jon Seligman one of the leaders of the excavation. 'We're talking Egypt, we're talking Turkey, Greece, maybe to southern Italy as well.' The excavation, which began two years ago, offers an impressive look at how ancient people massproduced wine. Barefoot workers once crushed grapes with their feet on the treading floor, before others collected the liquid and fermented it in large vats. Warehouses on site provided a place for workers to prepare the wine for sale. 'We were surprised to discover a sophisticated factory here, which was used to produce wine in commercial quantities,' stated the directors of the excavation, led by the Israel Antiquities Authority. Adding that the factory marketed about two million litres of wine (or 530,000 gallons) a year they



conducted manually.'

The factory produced a wine called 'Gaza And Ashkelon' wine, so named for the ports it passed through. The wine was shipped in 'Gazan jars,' which have been found across Europe, a sign, archeologists said, of the wine's popularity at its peak. 'They have a specific and very recognizable shape,' explained Seligman. 'The same jars were found in many places around the region, including Egypt, and we know that they were used for exporting the wine. People at the time, even children often drank wine instead of water. They considered it safer, since water could sometimes be contaminated. The wine factory itself also stands as a symbol of Yavne's lost prestige. Now a quiet city, it once reigned as one of the most influential places in Israel. said: 'We should remember that the whole who who was was remough to be put in a map from the period with

Gazan jars found at the Mayalenw leacufactoryee large churches,' said Seligman, noting that it was primarily home to Christians, as well as Jews and Samaritans, 'It was located in what

at the time was on a major road, called the sea highway, which went from north to south, and on its junction with the Sorek River.' In addition to exposing Yavne's impressive wine factory, the dig has also shed some light on the history of the town itself. Archeologists found ancient lanterns, children's tovs, and other signs of industry. 'We have been exposing an industrial area of ancient Yavne,' Seligman explained. We found remains of other industries, for example, producing glass and metal.

'We also found remains from other periods, such as a house from the ninth century and some other buildings from the interim period between the Byzantine and Islamic periods.'

Significantly, archeologists even found traces of an even older wine factory. Another wine press discovered on the site appears to date back some 2,300 years, or to the Persian period. The Mishna [Old Torah] even mentions a vineyard in Yavne. 'In the Mishna it is said that after the destruction of Jerusalem [which the Romans destroyed in 70 AD], the Jewish leadership migrated to Yavne, and that the sages of Yavne lived in a vineyard and studied Torah,' the archeologists explained.

'The excavation shows a continuum of existence of the wine industry at the site over many centuries.' As for the wine itself? Seligman says that the Yavne factory produced a 'prestige ... light white wine.' According to ancient texts, he said, people of the era found it 'agreeable to the taste.'

Ingredients: Meatballs:



Instructions:

Make the meatballs first: Combine everything and mix thoroughly.

Form meatballs and roll between your palms (Otherwise, meatballs will fall apart in the soup).

You should make around 20 to 24 meatballs, set aside.

Combine chicken broth, onion, celery, tomatoes and their liquid, cumin, oregano and corriander leaves in a large pot.

Bring to boil, and reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes.



Drop meatballs in the soup (Make sure the soup is slightly boiling, the meatballs need to be cooked quickly).

Return to simmer and cook another 10 minutes.

Add coriander and cook 10 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, to taste.

You could top the soup with cooked rice, or just by itself.

Pumpkin and Potato Soup

Prep time: 1hr 10mins / Serves 6-8

Ingredients:

2 ounces butter or 2 ounces margarine Onion, peeled and sliced

1 garlic glove, crushed

2 lbs pumpkin, peeled and diced

12 ounces potatoes, peeled and diced

1.5 teaspoons tomato paste



2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups chicken stock or 2 1/2 cups vegetable stock

Salt & freshly ground black pepper

1 teaspoon lemon juice

1/2 teaspoon ground allspice

2¹/₂ cups milk

6 tablespoons sour cream

Instructions:

Melt butter in a large saucepan and sauté onions and garlic very gently until soft but not browned.

Add pumpkin and potatoes and cook for a few minutes, then add tomato paste, stock, seasonings, lemon juice and allspice and bring to boil.

Cover pan and simmer gently for about 40 minutes or until very tender.

Puree in a blender or food processor and return to a clean pan.

Add milk and bring back to boil, whisking continuously. Simmer for 2-3 minutes. Adjust seasonings and stir in sour cream.

WHO 'confident' current COVID-19 vaccines will work against Omicron.

A World Health Organization senior scientist said Tuesday that "there is no doubt" about the efficacy of current vaccines to protect Omicron infected patients from severe forms of COVID-19. The current vaccines are effective against Omicron, which does not appear to be more dangerous than Delta, the variant that circulates most in the world. This comes as Poland and several other countries across Central and Eastern Europe battle a massive surge of new infections and deaths fuelled by the transmissible Delta variant, and amid fears the current vaccines will be less effective against the new Omicron variant. "We have very effective vaccines that have proven to be effective against all variants so far, in terms of severity of disease and hospitalisation, and there is no reason to think this would not be the case with Omicron," said Dr Michal Ryan, executive director of the WHO Health Emergencies Programme. However, Ryan acknowledged that vaccines might be less effective against

Omicron, which is characterised by a

very high number of mutations. But "it

is highly unlikely" that the variant

could escape vaccine protection



The WHO emergency manager stressed that studies of the variant detected only on November 24th by the South African authorities and which was since spotted in dozens of countries were still in their infancy. "The general pattern we are seeing so far shows no increase in severity. In fact, some places in southern Africa are reporting milder symptoms," Ryan insisted. The appearance of this new variant has caused wide panic in Europe, which is already experiencing a fifth wave of COVID-19 cases caused by the Delta variant. The WHO has confirmed over 400 infections across the continent since the first case was discovered. Several countries around the world have announced border closures, including for South Africans.

The Austrian government turned to mandatory vaccination for all of its citizens, while Norway announced on Tuesday that it was strengthening health measures to combat an outbreak of coronavirus, including limiting the number of people at home events.

However, the WHO has advised governments to only use mandatory vaccination as a last resort in fighting the pandemic.

On Wednesday, BioNTech's Chief Medical Officer, Özlem Türeci, said that the coronavirus vaccine developed jointly by BioNTech and Pfizer neutralises the Omicron variant of the virus after three doses. A laboratory study by its makers found that "three doses of our vaccine neutralise the Omicron variant", but warn-ed that "two doses show significantly reduce neutralization of this new variant." Pfizer and BioNTech also said that an Omicron-specific version of the anti-coronavirus vaccine, currently in development by BioNTech, would be available by March.



LUMBALGIA AND ACUPUNCTURE

Lower back pain is localized in the area that goes from the last rib to the gluteal area. According to traditional Chinese medicine, this area houses the body's energy base. Low back pain is a major health problem in industrialized countries, where it is estimated that 70% of the population suffer from it at any given time.

ACUPUNCTURE, AN EFFECTIVE TREATMENT

Facing with lower back pain, it must be determined if it is a mechanical pain, which worsens with physical activity and improves with rest, or due to a nerve root alteration or an inflammatory pain or visceral disease, since the treatment is different in each case. Acupuncture is an effective treatment for the majority of lower back pain, including also those associated with a nerve root disorder. With acupuncture and through electrical, thermal or mechanical stimulation of the appropriate points, muscle and tendon relaxation and neuromodulation of pain are achieved. That is, a blockage in the transmission of the painful impulse.

THE LUMBAR ZONE, KEY

During activities of daily living or during physical exercise, technically incorrect movements can be performed which, carried out repeatedly, can negatively affect the lower back, which is responsible for a large part of the forces generated. Regarding its structure, the lumbar area has five vertebrae that we represent with the letter L and the corresponding number from L1 to L5. Between two vertebrae we find the intervertebral disc. The vertebrae provide the rigidity and the discs the elasticity; this combination makes it possible to withstand significant pressures and at the same time have a wide controlled mobility in different planes.

The natural curvature of the lower back is called lordosis. he intervertebral disc is a viscoelastic structure that acts as a shock absorbing system. The discs are prepared to absorb pressure, so they have 60-90% water, but great care must be taken because from 15° of flexion the disc can already be injured. Hyperflexion of the lumbar spine, as well as hyperextension or torsion of the same, can eventually produce excessive pressure on the intervertebral disc and joint structures, favoring the appearance of I ower back pain.

With age and use, the spine wears out naturally and by age 50, most lumbar discs are degenerated, the last segments, from L3 to L5, being the most affected. It should also be noted that the normal pressure that the disc receives without any load suffers an increase equivalent to twice the weight of the body with a flexion of 20°, both in the sitting and standing positions. It is convenient to move from time to time, promoting circulation and relieving the tensions that are produced. Hence the importance of sitting properly, because we spend many hours a day in this position.

BACKGROUND PREVENTION

When it comes to doing simple tasks at home or at work, it is important to adopt appropriate postures to damage our lower back as little as possible. It is necessary to practice exercises correctly and safely, guided by physiotherapists who adapt them to our age, physical condition and weaknesses of our locomotor system, in order to maintain optimal muscle tone and smoothly and harmoniously strengthen our paravertebral muscles. Excessive work or unusual activity end up giving an imbalance that reduces our energy and can translate into lower back pain.

Finally, at a less physical level, highlight that intense or lasting worries or fear, due to job loss, financial problems, etc., contribute to increased tension in the lower back. Acupuncture also helps in these cases due to Its good results on an emotional level, which are worked in conjunction with the physical plane.

There is scientific evidence on the clinical benefit of medical acupuncture, always insisting that it is not incompatible with other treatments, but complementary to conventional systems. It also means significantly reducing the consumption of drugs in chronic disease, increasing the quality of life.

Antibiotic Guardians

WE ARE FACING A global catastrophic threat as more and more bacteria becomes resistant leaving us with more and more untreatable infections. While over the last thirty years, we have discovered at least one new infectious disease, very few new antibiotics have been developed leaving our pharmaceutical armoury almost empty as bacteria evolve and become resistant.

November 18 is European Antibiotic Awareness Day, an annual European public health initiative, to raise awareness about the threat to public health of antibiotic resistance and prudent antibiotic use. The latest data confirms that across the European Union the number of patients infected by resistant bacteria is increasing and that antibiotic resistance is a major threat to public health.

Before the discovery of antibiotics, thousands of people died from bacterial diseases, such as pneumonia or infection following surgery. Antibiotics were once considered "wonder drugs"- efficiently fighting diseases from pneumonia, diarrhea, ear and sinus infections. Since antibiotics have been discovered and used, more and more bacteria, which were originally susceptible, have become resistant and developed numerous different means of fighting against antibiotics. Because resistance is increasing and few new antibiotics have been discovered and marketed in recent years, the problem of antibiotic resistance is now a major public health threat. Yesterday's wonder drugs have become not so wonderful in face of new super bacteria ironically mutated through the misuse of antibiotics.

Data from the European Antimicrobial Resistance Surveillance Network (EARS-Net) show that there is a North-South gradient with low rates of resistance in Scandinavian countries and the Netherlands and high resistance rates in Southern Europe. Countries with lower resistance rates have generally lower use of antibiotics, whereas countries with higher antibiotic resistance rates use more antibiotics. For those who live here full or part time, you should be aware that amongst western countries, Spain has one of the highest rates of antimicrobial consumption, and antimicrobial resistance. Embarrassingly, it is the medical profession that is most culpable for the inappropriate use of antibiotics. Studies indicate that nearly 50% of an-

timicrobial use in hospitals is unnecessary or inappropriate. Some doctors may not have kept up to date on the latest protocols for the right use of antibiotics. Other doctors write out prescriptions to "be safe". In August, I was interviewed by the BBC as to proposals by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence, NICE, to sanction doctors

who are "soft touches" for antibiotic

During the BBC interview, I pointed out and continue to maintain that patient demands put pressure on doctors to prescribe antibiotics even though they are ineffective for their infections. Almost everyday I am asked for antibiotics for viral infections, such as a cold, cough, flu or most bronchitis. It would be easier to write out the prescription than face the frustration and, sometimes, anger when I explain that antibiotics are not going to make them feel better, make them less contagious

or cure their viral infections. In fact, each time a person takes antibiotics, sensitive bacteria are killed, but the resistant germs are left to grow, $mutate\, and\,$

multiply. Repeated, inappropriate use of antibiotics will jeopardize the effectiveness of essential drugs leaving you more vulnerable to the life-threatening super bacterias. Hospitals, clinics and your own doctor's surgery are great breeding areas for microbes! Viruses and bacterias are spread from patient to patient in airborne molecules and through physical contact. Medical professionals may forget to wash their hands or change gloves between patients! Hygiene is one of the most important factors in preventing the spread of contagious infections. Antibiotics are needed when your doctor diagnoses you with an

infection caused by a bacteria. Lab tests are essential to make a good diagnosis.

A sore throat caused by Streptococcus A can not be definitively diagnosed by simply looking at the throat. - no matter how much redness and pus there is.

> Acute bronchitis, or chest cold, occurs when the bronchial tubes leading to the lungs become inflamed. This

usually follows an upper respiratory infection like a cold. Antibiotics are rarely required in acute bronchitis as it is almost always viral in origin -no matter how green and gooky the sputum you are coughing up. Acute rhinosinusitis had been traditionally treated with antibiotics, however a study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association in December 2007 found that antibiotics were ineffective in treating the majority of these infections. Antibiotic therapy should be reserved for acute rhinosinusitis patients meeting specific criteria and then should be narrow-spectrum agents targeting the most likely pathogens such as Streptococcus pneumoniae or Haemophilus influenzae. Preventing an infection is easier than treating one. No antibiotic or other medication is as effective as practicing good hand hygiene. Keep vour immune system healthy with a vitamin-rich, low-fat diet. Reduce environmental risk factors by not smoking and avoiding second-hand smoke.

4. Don't expect miracles




5. Start as you mean to go on



struggling to cope when you were young and had wished that you were bigger and could help, your adult mind may still be holding onto that childhood belief. 


