

Minigolf La Herradura

La Herradura now has its own minigolf course called Minigolf La Herradura which has been built by an ex-golf trainer, a former member of the PGA of America.

The man behind it, Scott Huston, is an American who has lived in several European countries including Germany, Northern Ireland and Denmark. For the last 17 years he has called La Herradura home.

Minigolf La Herradura lies between the main road (N340) and Calle Las Palomas 12 where the entrance is, just one street behind the post office. It has 18 holes and covers a good part of the 1,100 sq/m plot - on the rest of it are two petanque lanes and an ar-ea for racquet sports such as mini tennis, air badminton and the new fad of "Pickleball". There is also space for restrooms, administrative reception and a store room.

When asked how he decided on this project, he said he had played minigolf as a kid and often on vacations over the years. "At 56 years old I decided I had a better chance of scoring well on golf holes measuring four to six meters that 400 to 600 meters."

He added, "One thing I'd like to make clear, as this is a very novel concept in Spain, is that minigolf is not a short form of the golf you'd see on TV, but simply putting the ball into a hole through various obstacles. The holes are made of artificial grass as is the racquet sports area and the course is made from existing land with gravel path-ways. No water is required for the entire plot aside for the restrooms."



Protests spread through Europe from the fear and uncertainty of the rising cost of living

Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom have registered demonstrations in recent weeks against the increase in the cost of living One in five Europeans are surviving thanks to their savings and one in 10 skip a meal.



Pair arrested for stealing 280 chairs and 20 tables from catering establishments in Fuengirola and Mijas

National Police officers arrested two men, aged 37 and 19, for allegedly stealing 280 chairs, 20 tables and five umbrellas from half a dozen catering establishments in Fuengirola and Mijas. Those arrested acted at night taking advantage of the businesses being closed and transported the stolen items in a rental van. The value of the stolen furniture amounts to about 16,000 euros.

Malaga families spend 65 euros more a month more on food than a year ago

Prices in the province have risen by 16.2%, more than anywhere else in Spain. The latest inflation figures show that shoppers in Malaga province are paying 16.2% more for basic food items than they did a year ago, which is significantly above the national average (14.4%) and behind only Badajoz (18.6%) and Cuenca (17.7%).

Spain's new cycling law ends impunity for driving offenders who cause death or serious injury

Known as Spain's new cycling law, the bill was approved last month and is already in force. This reform of the

Four years after its construction was finished, the Caminito del Rey visitor centre in Malaga province finally opened its doors late October. A bus service will connect the visitor centre with the entrance and exit of the walkway route, parts of which are suspended high above a gorge.

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE TAX FORM 210

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE TAX FORM 210 - (ANNUAL DEEM INCOME TAX) - FOR NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY OWNERS

The Tax Returns that all Non-Resident Property owners should be submitting annually is called, Modelo 210, and the period for submitting this declaration is the calendar year, (i.e. 1st January to 31st December each year). The Annual Deem Income Tax due for the tax year 2021, must be paid before the 31st December 2022.

Many NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY OWNERS have not paid these annual taxes, not because they wish to commit tax fraud, but due to mere ignorance of the existence of this tax. Usually because nobody has ever informed them.

Everyone should be aware that ignorance of the Law is not an excuse for not paying this tax, so we recommend any NON-RESIDENT who owns a real estate property in Spain seeks tax advice to make sure they know what their tax obligations in Spain are.

The tax form 210 is operated on a self-assessed system. This means that Non-residents have the obligation to prepare, calculate and pay their own Deem Income Tax every year.

Nowadays, the Inland Revenue computers can

easily check who is not paying these taxes, so it is important to ensure that the annual tax form 210 is paid and submitted on time every year.

As this is not an easy process, we recommend that non-resident property owners should get professional assistance to prepare these annual taxes.

If you are a NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY OWNER IN SPAIN, you still have plenty of time to comply with this Tax law. It's better to do it before the Inland Revenue contacts you.

Wildlife gardening in a mediterranean climate.

The story of storeys

When planning your garden, try to incorporate as many storeys as you can: the upper storey (or canopy), mid-storey and understorey all have important roles for birds and other wildlife. The upper canopy, the taller trees, is where many birds feed, and it is also used as a vantage point to check for predators. The mid-storey is usually made up of climbing plants, which offer a safe bridge from the upper canopy to the understorey, and larger shrubs. Depending on the plants chosen for the midlevel, this can also provide food for insectivorous and nectar-feeding birds. The understorey is very important for the groundfeeding birds. If you have a tree surrounded by lawn, then birds (such as blackbirds and robins) will be feeding in the open with

a greater distance to cover to get back to safety. A good understorey will incorporate native plants that provide both cover and food for birds that feed on or near the ground. Plant diversity, in terms of both species and height, will encourage a range of birds in your garden. Where there are only one or two dominant plant species you may similarly notice that one or two types of birds dominate your garden. For example in Australia the popularity of exotic flowering plants and native hybrids with larger flowers has been very beneficial to the Noisy Miner (Manorina melanocephala) but detrimental to the smaller honeyeaters which have been pushed out of many urban gardens. A range of flower sizes and types should mean that there are different plants available to different birds. It's not just dead wood If you look carefully at any

large dead tree, or large

trees with dead branches, then you will see nature's apartment blocks. If there is no danger in leaving dead trees or branches in place, then consider waiting for nature to take its course. Dead wood is a source of insects for birds and other animals, as well as providing important nesting places for woodpeckers, owls and other birds such as the Eurasian wryneck (Jynx torquata), which nested one year in a hole in one of our large oak trees. Even once they have fallen, dead branches continue to provide cover, basking sites or foraging sites for lizards, birds and small mammals. Don't remove fallen logs if you don't need to, or if they fall in an inconvenient place simply move them to another spot in the garden. Lawn alternatives There are very good reasons to use lawn alternatives for local wildlife. Lawns provide little in the way of food for birds and

pollinators. Wildlife-friendly alternatives on the other hand, like native grasses or groundcover plants such as Thymus roegneri, will support a wide range of bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Traditional lawns also require more chemicals than lawn alternatives. Many fertilisers, herbicides and pesticides used on lawns have been linked to bird mortality.

Mud puddles

When bird-watching along remote rivers we have often seen large groups of butterflies gathered at the water's edge, and wondered why. This activity is called "puddling" and principally occurs around mud or where soil is saturated. The butterflies are gathering sodium and other minerals from the wet soil using their probosces. This sodium is essentia 1 for successful breeding as butterflies use a lot of sodium in producing and laying their eggs. So why

your garden with some strategically placed mud puddles? Standing water should be avoided because of mosquitoes, so try to plan puddles that can be remoistened as necessary but which have sufficient drainage. Putting mud in a shallow tray or bowl, or in raised wooden boxes, should do the trick, and could create an interesting feature in your garden. Certainly if you succeed in getting it covered with butterflies it will become quite a talking point... Your mud can be either dirt- or sand-based, but try to use soil with a high mineral content and little organic material. You can even make a sodium solution with sea salt and water to add to the mud for a richer offering. Other wildlife will also appreciate access to a good mud source. Some birds, like house martins (Delichon urbicum) and barn swallows (Hirundo rustica), use mud when building their nests. Many types of bees also build hives or fill breeding tubes with mud. As with feeders



and water, make sure your mud puddles are protected from predators and ensure that the soil and water are free from chemicals such as garden herbicides and pesticides.

Bare earth

Each year you'll see a female mammoth wasp (Megascolia maculata flavifrons), the largest in Europe measuring up to 6 cm. They are solitary wasps, are not dangerous and do not build hives. Instead they burrow into the earth and nest underground. For these wasps and many solitary bees it helps if you leave patches of bare earth (perhaps in the midst of shrubbery), particularly if you have south-facing slopes with well-drained and sandy soils. The warmth on south-facing slopes helps on cold spring mornings and soil that isn't too compacted makes for easier tunnelling. Solitary bees and wasps are fantastic pollinators in your garden: research in Europe found that some species had to visit over 2,000 flowers in order to gather enough pollen to feed one larva.




At the same time, it was determined that she was an "old lady", so has been called "Grandma" (or Abuela in Spanish)



Carrot Soup

Carrot soup

Serves:- 6

Ingredients:-

- 10 carrots, scraped and sliced
- 1 1/2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cups water
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose (plain) flour
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 4 cups fat-free milk
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley



Preparation:-

In a large saucepan, heat the carrots, sugar and water. Cover and simmer until the carrots are tender, about 20 minutes. Drain the carrots, reserving some of the liquid. Set aside.

In a separate saucepan over medium-high heat, whisk together flour, pepper, nutmeg and milk. Cook, stirring constantly, until the white sauce thickens. In a blender or food processor, add the cooked carrots and white sauce. Puree until smooth. Add reserved liquid to desired consistency. Ladle into separate bowls and garnish each with 1 teaspoon parsley. Serve immediately.



Vegetarian Chili Soup

Vegetarian chili Soup

Serves:-8

Ingredients:-

- 2 cups diced onion
- 1 cup diced celery
- 1 cup diced bell pepper
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons water
- 2 Fresno peppers, diced
- 2 quarts crushed tomatoes (no salt added)
- 2 cups cooked pinto beans (no salt added; if canned, rinse under water)
- 2 tablespoons ground cumin
- 1 tablespoon chipotle pepper (or smoked paprika)
- 1 tablespoon ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano

Preparation:-

In a stockpot over low heat, cook onion, celery, bell pepper and garlic in 2 tablespoons of water until onions become translucent, about 10 minutes. Add the remaining ingredients. Cover and simmer for 1-2 hours, stirring occasionally. If chili becomes too thick, thin with a little water.











Clam Chowder

Clam chowder

Serves:- 6

Ingredients:-

- 1 cup diced carrots
- 1 cup diced celery
- 2 cups diced yellow onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 ounces lean ham, diced
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1 cup diced fresh clams
- 1/2 cup clam juice
- 2 cups low-fat milk
- 1 1/2 cups low-sodium vegetable stock
- 1 teaspoon minced thyme
- 1 teaspoon minced oregano
- 1 teaspoon fennel seed
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 cup diced red potatoes
- 1/4 cup brown rice, uncooked

Preparation:-

In a saucepan over medium heat, saute carrot, celery, onion, garlic and ham in canola oil until lightly brown, about 10 minutes. Rinse clams under running water, drain. Add clams and clam juice, continue to cook slowly to reduce volume by half. Add milk, stock, seasonings, potatoes and rice. Bring to simmer, reduce heat and cook for 1 hour, until rice is cooked and stew has thickened considerably.

Gazpacho with chickpeas

Ingredients:-

1 can (15 ounces) chickpeas (also called garbanzo beans), rinsed and drained

6 cups unsalted vegetable juice

1 cup (about 16) cherry tomatoes, quartered

1/2 cup chopped, seeded cucumber

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro or parsley

1/4 teaspoon hot pepper sauce 1 to 3 garlic cloves, minced 1/4 cup lime juice 6 lime wedges


Preparation:-

In a large bowl, add the chickpeas, vegetable juice, tomatoes, cucumber, onion, cilantro, hot pepper sauce, garlic and lime juice. Stir well. RAMSAY HUNT SYNDROME

ALL ABOUT RAMSAY HUNT SYNDROME: THE TYPE OF **FACIAL PARALYSIS THAT JUSTIN BIEBER SUFFERS.**

The famous Canadian singer Justin Bieber has been affected by Ramsay Hunt syndrome, a rare pathology. Because of this, he has had to stop his concert performances in order to recover quickly, which is why we want to tell you in greater detail what this disease that has affected this talented character is all about.

But what is Ramsay Hunt Syndrome?

The little-known Ramsay Hunt Syndrome is a type of facial paralysis, triggered by the presence of a varicella-zoster virus infection in the ear, which attacks the facial nerve, causing painful symptoms and possible hearing loss in more severe cases. The varicella-zoster virus, also known as shingles, emerged for the first time in 1907 and the neurologist Ramsay Hunt was the one who described the presence in several cases of papules in the ear and mouth area, and along with it the presence of facial paralysis peripheral.

What are the symptoms of Ramsay **Hunt Syndrome?**

The main symptoms of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome are the presence of

blisters, rashes or eruptions around the ear or internally in it (this symptom may not always be present), as well as weakness or state of facial paralysis on the side of the ear. affected. On the other hand, there are other symptoms that can also occur in this syndrome and that are characteristic of facial paralysis, these are:

- Earache
- Fever
- Hearing loss
- Sensations of dizziness
- · Difficulty closing the eye
- · Sensation of dry mouth and eyes
- Loss of taste perception
- Tinnitus (ringing in the ears)
- Nausea
- Vomiting

It is important to emphasize that due to the fact that this syndrome can present a number of signs and symptoms that are so varied, it can be classified into four stages:

- Stage I: Presence of otalgia and rash in the territory of the facial nerve
- Stage II: Includes the symptoms described above and ipsilateral peripheral facial paralysis
- Stage III: Includes the presence of pain, rash, facial paralysis, tinnitus, hearing loss and dizziness
- Stage IV: Involvement of other cranial nerves, mostly cranial nerve V.

What are the causes and risk factors of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome?

Ramsay Hunt syndrome is caused by the outbreak or reactivation of the varicella-zoster virus in the geniculate ganglion of cranial nerve VII and nearby nerves. This reactivation of the virus can be caused by the weakness in the body's defense system in the presence of this infection, likewise the consumption of medications or immunosuppressive drugs make people more vulnerable to suffering from this syndrome, in addition to suffering from other pathologies such as HIV, COPD, chronic kidney disease, depression, among others, can make the person more fragile or weak from the appearance of shingles or herpes zoster.

How is the diagnosis of Ramsay **Hunt Syndrome?**

In order to have an accurate diagnosis, it is important that, in the presence of the aforementioned

symptoms, a doctor, after a prior assessment and physical examination of the area of his opinion, certifies the presence of this syndrome. The doctor is the trained staff and will be the one who evaluates and decides whether or not it is a Ramsay Hunt syndrome or, failing that, another type of facial paralysis caused by herpes zoster. Part of this evaluative process begins with the achievement or not of commands to open and close the eye and the mouth, as well as to smile. It is also important to know the background and medical history of the patient, as well as the characteristics of the pain, since pain from herpetic neuralgia is characterized by burning and jolting sensations, loss or increase in sensitivity, and numbness.

How is Ramsay Hunt Syndrome treated?

The treatment of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome goes hand in hand with several types of treatments, among which the use of antiviral agents in the first instance stands out with the aim of reducing the presence of the most acute symptoms, and accelerating the process of combating the disease. On the other hand, the use of steroids is also part of the treatment in conjunction with antivirals, in this way it seeks to reduce the inflammatory process, the presence of dizziness, as well as accelerate the healing process of skin wounds in the area. Other treatments to use are analgesics to help reduce severe acute pain, although sometimes antivirals also have this analgesic function. Last but not least is the PHYSIOTHERAPEUTIC approach, which seeks to stimulate and maintain muscle function, given from the brain areas to the face area, and from there improve and control facial movement in the best possible way. Rehabilitation and physiotherapy treatment in facial paralysis has shown great benefit and efficacy in the recovery of this pathology; facial exercises

in front of the mirror and the application of different techniques such as electrostimulation, kinesiotape, thermotherapy and acupuncture, among other physiotherapeutic tools are used for the treatment of facial paralysis.

What are the possible complications of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome?

Complications after the presence of Ramsay Hunt Syndrome are usually frequent in adults and immunosuppressed people, especially post-herpetic neuralgia in which chronic pain can be present for a long time until the skin lesions (blisters) resolve. have completely healed. Likewise, the presence of allodynia (abnormal perception of pain) is another of the sequelae or complications of this syndrome and is quite recurrent. In another instance, in severe cases, damage to the cranial nerves, secondary bacterial infections, hearing loss on the affected side, the presence of tinnitus, neurological disorders, meningoencephalitis, and myelitis may be part of the consequences of this syndrome. Therefore, being assessed and treated by a health professional early will be of great help to prevent this virus from leaving greater consequences and complications after its outbreak.



November 18th is the 15th European **Antibiotic Awareness** Day, an annual European public health initiative, to raise awareness about the threat to public health of antibiotic resistance and prudent antibiotic use. The latest data confirms that across the European Union the number of patients infected by resistant bacteria is increasing and that antibiotic resistance is a major threat to public health.

Before the discovery of antibiotics, thousands of people died from bacterial diseases, such as pneumonia or infection following surgery. Antibiotics were once considered "wonder drugs"efficiently fighting diseases from pneumonia, diarrhea, ear and sinus infections. Since antibiotics have been discovered and used, more and more bacteria, which were originally susceptible, have become resistant and developed numerous different means of fighting against antibiotics. Because resistance is increasing and few new antibiotics have been discovered and marketed in recent years, the problem of antibiotic resistance is now a major public health threat. Yesterday's wonder drugs have become not so wonderful in face of new super bacteria

ironically mutated

through the misuse of antibiotics.

Data from the **European Antimicrobial** Resistance Surveillance Network (EARS-Net) show that there is a North-South gradient with low rates of resistance in Scandinavian countries and the Netherlands and high resistance rates in Southern Europe. Countries with lower resistance rates have generally lower use of antibiotics. whereas countries with higher antibiotic resistance rates use more antibiotics. Embarrassingly, it is the medical profession that is most culpable for the inappropriate use of antibiotics. Studies indicate that nearly 50% of antibiotic use in hospitals is unnecessary or inappropriate. Some doctors may not have kept up to date on the latest protocols for the right use of antibiotics. Other doctors write out prescriptions to "be safe".

Patient demands can put pressure on doctors to prescribe antibiotics even though they are ineffective for their infections. Almost everyday I am asked for antibiotics for viral infections, such as a cold, cough, flu or most bronchitis. It usually would be easier to write out the prescription than face the frustration and, sometimes, anger when I explain that antibiotics are not going

to make them feel better. make them less contagious or cure their viral infections. In fact. each time a person takes antibiotics, sensitive bacteria are killed, but the resistant germs are left to grow, mutate and multiply. Repeated, inappropriate use of antibiotics will jeopardize the effectiveness of essential drugs leaving you more vulnerable to the life-threatening super bacterias.

Hospitals, clinics and your own doctor's surgery are great breeding areas for microbes! Viruses and bacterias are spread from patient to patient in airborne molecules and through physical contact. Medical professionals may forget to wash their hands or change gloves between patients! Hygiene is one of the most important factors in preventing the spread of contagious infections.

Antibiotics are needed when your doctor diagnoses you with an infection caused by a bacteria. Lab tests are essential to make a good diagnosis.

A sore throat caused by Streptococcus A can not be definitively diagnosed by simply looking at the throat. - no matter how much redness and pus there is.

Acute bronchitis, or chest cold, occurs when the bronchial tubes leading to the lungs become inflamed. This usually follows an upper respiratory infection like



a cold. Antibiotics are rarely required in acute bronchitis as it is almost always viral in origin -no matter how green and gooky the sputum you are coughing up. Acute rhinosinusitis had been traditionally treated with antibiotics, however a study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association in found that antibiotics were ineffective in treating the majority of

these infections.
Antibiotic therapy should be reserved for acute rhinosinusitis patients meeting specific criteria and then should be narrow-spectrum agents targeting the most likely pathogens such as Streptococcus pneumoniae or Haemophilus influenzae.

Preventing an infection is easier than treating one. No antibiotic or other

medication is as effective as practicing good hand hygiene. Keep your immune system healthy with a vitamin-rich, low-fat diet. Reduce environmental risk factors by not smoking and avoiding second-hand smoke.


Who are my clients?




Here are 12 foods that may rev up your metabolism.

1. Protein-rich foods

Protein-rich foods such as meat, fish, eggs, dairy, legumes, nuts, and seeds, could help increase your metabolism for a few hours.

This is because they require your body to use more energy to digest them. This is known as the thermic effect of food (TEF). The TEF refers to the number of calories your body needs to digest, absorb, and process the nutrients in your meals. Research shows that protein-rich foods increase TEF the most. For example, they increase your metabolic rate by 15–30%, compared with 5–10% for carbs and 0–3% for fats.



2. Mineral rich foods

The minerals iron and selenium each play different but equally important roles in the proper functioning of your body. However, they do have one thing in common. They're both required for the proper functioning of your thyroid gland, which regulates your metabolism. Research shows that a diet too low in iron or selenium may reduce your thyroid's ability to produce sufficient amounts of hormones, which could slow down your metabolism. To help your thyroid function to the best of its ability, include selenium- and iron-rich foods like meat, seafood, legumes, nuts, and seeds in your daily menu.

3. Chili pepper

Capsaicin, a chemical found in chili peppers, may boost your metabolism by slightly increasing the rate at which your body burns calories. In fact, a review of 20 research studies notes that capsaicin, from supplements or the peppers themselves may help your body burn around 50 extra calories per day. Moreover, capsaicin may have appetitereducing properties.

Similarly, adding cayenne pepper to your meal may increase the amount of fat your body burns for energy, especially following a high fat meal. However, this fatburning effect may only apply to people unaccustomed to consuming spicy foods.





Causes of Depression - Chemical Imbalance or Social Challenges?

Disconnection from a Hopeful or Secure Future

If you are severely depressed you find it hard to contemplate, plan for, or get excited about the future. Equally, if you feel you have no control over your life or destiny, for example through poverty, you are more likely to slide into depression.

The Role of Genes and Brain Changes

The brain makes it own structures based on experience. So if you are constantly unhappy or frightened your neural pathways and brain activity reflect this and create a pattern.

Thankfully, with our brains being adaptable, we can change these pathways when we are happier and feeling safe.

Genes can also lead us to being more prone to depression but your genes are activated by your environment, so mostly they only come into play when a person has experienced great stress, adverse living conditions or childhood trauma.

So to stop the depression epidemic what do we need to do?

Make Work More Meaningful

This can be a challenging one to change but one company in America has led the way with an

innovative workplace change. It's a bike shop and under the old system the workers felt unfulfilled and depressed, they were just cogs in a wheel. Then one of the employees took over and instead of running the shop as the boss, he set it up as a cooperative. Everyone has shares in the business, everyone has a say and everyone feels valued and

All the workers are dramatically less anxious, stressed and depressed than they were before, even though they are still doing the same job.

Reconnect with Others

Instead of being focused on me, me, me (which is so easy to do when suffering from depression) it's time to think of helping others, of building connections and building a supportive community around you.

Working on community projects helps people reconnect with each other, as well as gaining pride and satisfaction in their work. If this is very difficult where you live you can try and find online groups with similar interests so that you still become part of a community.

Reconnect to Meaningful Values

In São Paulo, in Brazil, the city's government banned all outdoor advertising. 70% of the population said they felt healthier and less under pressure without the constant reminder to own more material goods. Often what we buy fills a void and gives us an instant short-lasting high.

But this can also remove you from what really matters: family, friends, honesty etc and keep you from the satisfaction that these key values bring. In looking closely at why you spend and what your true values are, you can change your perspective and reduce depression.

Find Sympathetic Joy

Often we don't need to experience things for ourselves to feel happiness. Sharing in someone else's happiness can often lift our spirits, for example watching a newly married couple or puppies playing. Compassion for and empathy with others helps us to connect. Loving-kindness meditation can help to build your compassion and desire to help others.

Acknowledge and Overcome Childhood Trauma Work on childhood trauma helps to release anxiety, shame, guilt and fear and allows you to move forward in life and to be happy. There are many different avenues open: counselling, CBT, NLP and Rapid Transformational Therapy to name but a few.

Restore Faith in the Future

The Canadian town of Dauphin did an experiment. They gave every citizen \$19,000 to see what the effects were. It benefited the community in many ways but one result was that mood disorders and depression dropped by 9% in just 3 years. People made big changes in their lives, some took degrees, some spent more time with their children and some took a lower paid job with more personal satisfaction. The future looked brighter, filled with more choices.

Living like this, people didn't need pills to help them cope with a mind numbing or difficult existence, they automatically became happier and more mentally stable.

So if you are struggling with depression, it is worth considering your social circumstances and seeing if you can make some changes. If you can make changes and feel happier you may want to reduce your medication but remember to speak to your doctor first.

4. Coffee

The caffeine found in coffee may help increase metabolic rate. Several studies have noted that people who consume at least 270 mg of caffeine daily, or the equivalent of about 3 cups of coffee, burn up to an extra 100 calories per day. However, its effects vary from person to person, based on individual characteristics such as body weight and age.



5. Tea

Tea contains health-boosting compounds called catechins that may work in tandem with caffeine to boost metabolic rate. In particular, both oolong and matcha green tea may increase fat oxidation and may help you burn extra calories when part of an exercise plan. In addition, oolong and green teas may help your body use stored fat for energy more effectively, increasing your fat-burning ability by up to 17%.



Hieronymus Bosch or El Bosco: a Netherlandish artist in Philip II's Spain

Lecture Description:

The fantastic worlds peopled by devils that the Early Netherlandish painter Hieronymus Bosch (d. 1516) created have often been 'explained' as the work of a visionary, a heretic, or even a hallucinating madman. Yet to his contemporaries Bosch was a gifted artist who received prestigious commissions and whose work inspired many. Long after Bosch's death his work was avidly collected by that most Catholic of kings, Philip II of Spain: this is why so many of his works are now housed in the Prado and in the Escorial, and why 'El Bosco' is often wrongly believed to have been a Spanish artist. This lecture will look at Bosch's art within its historical and cultural context in order to gain a better understanding of this intriguing painter whose works was to inspire surrealist artists such as Salvador Dalí.


Creating an Imaginary World - Theatre Design from Temple to Playhouse into the Picture Frame and out again Bertie Pearce
