



The Spanish government has announced it will give a temporary residence permit to foreigners without legal residency if they complete vocational training courses. Many undocumented migrants in Spain are forced into the black economy. No residencia means no social security. Some of the roughly 500,000 undocumented migrants are being offered temporary residency if they agree to complete vocational training, what's called Formación Profesional (FP) in Spanish.

The measure is part of the first draft of the royal decree on the Regulation of Vocational Training, initially approved in 2022. If it is greenlighted in Spain's Congress and Senate, it will bolster the rights and freedoms of foreigners in Spain and their social integration.

Spain mulls whether single parents should get double parental leave

Spain gives mothers and fathers 16 weeks of fully-paid parental leave each, but Spanish courts are now considering whether it's discriminatory that single parents don't get the same amount of accumulated leave with their babies.

The Spanish Supreme court is considering extending the current leave of 16 weeks to 26 weeks or even 32 weeks for single-parent families, in order to avoid discriminating against children that grow up in households with one parent, rather than those that have two.

According to the latest stats, 10 percent of households in Spain are run by single parents and 80 percent of these are women.

Eyes are now on the Spanish Supreme Court to make a ruling on the issue so that regional courts can follow suit. It is expected that they will make a decision before the end of 2023, as the rate of single-parent households in Spain continues to increase at a rate never seen before.

From the age of 16, women may abort without the permission of their mothers, fathers or guardians.

Elimination of the three days of reflection, currently required. Elimination of the obligation to provide information to women about the resources and aid available in case of continuing the pregnancy. It will only be done if they request it.

The new abortion law will allow the termination of a pregnancy from the age of 16 without parental permission

Rain of euro bills causes mad rush for money on Spanish highway

A crash on the A-7 near the southern city of Marbella sent €20,000 in cash flying out the window of a car. Nearby vehicles, including a bus, screeched to a halt as drivers raced to pick up the notes before the police arrived. Motorists driving on Spain's A-7 highway in the vicinity of Marbella were surprised to suddenly see €50 notes raining down on them. The collision of a vehicle whose occupants were carrying about €20,000 in cash resulted in the money "flying out" in every direction.

Several drivers stopped their cars in the middle of the motorway to grab the banknotes, which created a huge traffic jam and dangerous situations.



One dead, several injured in machete attack against churches in southern Spain

The assailant has been arrested, and authorities are investigating the case as a possible act of Islamic terrorism. Spanish police have arrested a machetewielding man who walked into two Catholic churches in the southern city of Algeciras during February, killing one person and injuring at least four more. The suspect is a 25year-old Moroccan national identified as Yasine Kanjaa by sources familiar with the investigation. Spain's high court, the Audiencia Nacional, is investigating the matter as a possible act of Islamic terrorism, although the Interior Ministry has not yet classified the attack as jihadist. Shortly after 6.30pm the suspect entered the Church of San Isidro, in the centre of this port city near the southern tip of Spain, and "began to argue with the parishioners, telling them that they should follow the Islamic religion." He left but returned less than an hour later, around 7.20pm, armed with a machete that he used to attack and seriously injure the priest, according to these same sources. The clergyman is reported to be in stable condition after receiving medical assistance.

The assailant then walked over to the Church of La Palma, located just 200 meters from the first temple, as a Mass service was ending. He began to throw religious images, crucifixes and candles on the floor and climbed up on the altar. The sexton asked him to leave several times, and the assailant chased him out of the church and to a public square called Plaza Alta, in the city centre, where he killed

him with the machete, according to eyewitnesses. The suspect, who had no previous criminal record, is in the custody of the National Police in Algeciras.

Drug trafficking on the Costa del Sol

Spanish police arrested 15 people, including actor and painter Jean-Claude Pautot, dismantling a drugtrafficking network that smuggled hundreds of kilos of narcotics into Europe. Jean-Claude Pautot served as a middleman between French and Spanish drug traffickers bringing cocaine into Europe from the Caribbean. He was arrested in December in Marbella as part of a joint operation between Spanish and French police.

Two men seriously injured from falls in Nerja

The two men, aged 63 and 40, were seperately taken to the Regional Hospital of Axarquía. Within two hours of each other the two men aged 63 and 40 were taken by ambulance to the Axarquía Regional Hospital. One of the men fell from a ladder while working in a house and the other man from an avocado tree on a rural farm in La Vega Tetouan, in the direction of Maro.

Man arrested for various robberies in rural homes in Nerja

The arrested man, 40 years old, a resident of the area and with a history of similar events, had sold part of the stolen machinery and technology, valued at 15,000 euros. A wave of robberies in farms in the rural area of the Río de la Miel, located to the east of the municipality of Nerja, had generated alert and concern among the residents of the area. A dozen homes had been violently assaulted while their residents were absent from them. The thefts began in December and continued into January. Apparently, the suspect always used the same 'modus operandis': he verified that there were no people in the homes to access them at dawn by forcing the locks and fences.

Apparently, during the search of his home, also located in the rural environment, several of the objects that had been reported as stolen were found.

Miguel Herrera, a Nerja resident with a mental illness who had been missing was found in good condition

The relatives of Miguel Herrera, a 63-year-old resident of Nerja who suffers from a mental illness and requires medication, had reported his disappearance to the Civil Guard. After more than 48 hours without knowing his whereabouts, he was found in good health, in an abandoned farmhouse in the area of the Río de la Miel, to the east of the municipality of Nerja.

Hashish found on Burriana beach in Nerja

A British man living in Nerja found 2 packages of hashish in the sand at Burriana Beach and alerted the Civil Guard.

Arrested for stabbing three Chinese bazaar shopkeepers where he tried to rob in Malaga

The National Police have arrested a 26-year-old man for his alleged involvement in three robberies with violence and intimidation committed in Chinese bazaars in the centre of Malaga. The victims suffered several cuts on their bodies and faces, although none of the injuries were serious. The National Police immediately deployed a large device in the vicinity of this area that allowed them to find the person investigated, who they located on board an electric scooter. Apparently, he still had blood stains on his hands, clothes and shoes.

Food prices rise more than 15 per cent in Spain

Inflation is the biggest headache for consumers since the Ukraine war crisis began almost a year ago. Prices have risen so much that the government reduced or eliminated IVA on basic foods. Despite this, food prices rose by 15.4% in January compared to a year ago. Prices in January compared to December reveal that bread had fallen by 0.2%, milk by 1.5% and eggs by 1.5%.

February and March:



Ouch! Helping your puppy play nicely

Puppies use their mouths just like we use our hands! They explore new things with their teeth, and when they interact and play with one-another you will see a lot of teeth!

So, how do we teach our puppies that the rules are different when it comes to interacting with their human friends? The first thing that is required is a lot of patience! Puppies mouth people to get attention and play. Your puppy will therefore need to learn that using their teeth on people NEVER works to get attention. Remember your attention comes in three forms (talk, touch and even eye contact). You will have to be very consistent whilst your puppy learns the 'rules' - and any time they put their teeth on you, quietly remove your skin/ clothes from your puppy's mouth. If they continue trying to mouth you, try turning away from them and crossing your arms - a clear signal that your attention has been withdrawn! If this still doesn't work you will need to walk away from your puppy and leave the room, closing the door behind you and leaving them to calm down for a moment before going back in. It is very important that it is YOU who leaves the room, instead of picking your puppy up and moving them away, as this still counts as attention! Once your puppy has calmed down and is doing something more suitable you can praise them and interact again remember, if they mouth you again you will again need to move yourself away. This can leave you feeling like a bit of a Yo-Yo to begin with, and you puppy may go through a period where they seem to get worse before they get better because they need to learn that this behaviour no longer works. Be very strict with yourself and make sure that you do not give in and respond when your puppy mouths you particularly hard or for a long time (you will only teach them to mouth harder/persist!). This training will eventually click and your puppy will learn not to use their teeth when interacting with people.

Although it can be very frustrating, try to avoid telling your puppy off for mouthing. Remember, the only reason they are doing it is to try and get you to interact with them – so any interaction could still reinforce their behaviour! In addition, telling them off may make them worried. Although this may work to stop your puppy in their tracks, it can drive more over the top, severe mouthing in the future, in addition to contributing to other issues. Simply stopping any reward for the behaviour is the safest and most effective way of dealing with mouthing in the long term.

A top tip for success is to keep a toy with you when you know your puppy is feeling lively.

You can let them chew on this as you play with them, instead of having the temptation of putting your hands in their mouths! Always keep a few different toys out so that your puppy has something

suitable to chew on at all times. You puppy is much less likely to mouth when they are tired out, so ensuring that they have the right kind of outlet when they are feeling energetic is half the battle!

We would advise against wearing your best clothes around puppy! It is far better to get changed into something you don't mind getting spoilt whilst you are training your puppy not to mouth. If you have young children that cannot put this advice into practise you will need to manage the situation more closely. It is a good idea to separate your child and puppy at times when either is feeling particularly excited, and/or to keep a light lead on your puppy in the house so that you can gently remove them from a situation without needing to tell them off or give them your attention when they are being 'naughty'!

If your puppy is showing an extreme mouthing and/or this advice does not seem to help ask an expert for advice.

Always get your puppy checked over by a vet if they have a sudden change in behaviour or are behaving in a way that is of concern—as this could be a related to a medical issue.

So, remember our top tips for preventing mouthing:

- Try not to shout at your puppy, as they will associate mouthing you with getting your attention, or potentially get scared.
 If your dog mouths you, don't respond with your attention. Remember your attention comes in three forms talk, touch, and eye contact. Turning away and crossing your arms removes all three forms of attention.
- If this still doesn't work, you may need to leave the room, close the door behind you and let them calm down for a moment

before you return to the room.

- Positively praise your dog when they stop mouthing and interact with you in a gentler way.
- If you have children in your home, you
 may need to supervise their contact with
 your puppy. If your puppy or child is feeling
 particularly excitable, it may be wise to
 keep them apart.



7 key points from Spain's new Animal Welfare Law Who gets the dog after a break-up? Spain starts shared custody.

Pets in Spain cannot be left alone for longer than 72 hours, equal to three days. This applies to cats, hamsters, rabbits, birds and other pets. However, the maximum amount of time a dog can be left alone at home in Spain is now 24 hours. Leaving them locked out on terraces, balconies or kennels during this period is strictly forbidden. The fine for leaving your pet alone for longer than the permitted time is up to €10,000. Most animal experts and vets will without a doubt recommend that the time dogs spend alone be far less than a day nonetheless. from a maximum of two hours for puppies to six hours for adult dogs. The only legal exception within the canine world are shepherd dogs that are fulfilling that very role, and they will need to have a geolocator on them and an outdoor shelter available to them. For cats, animal associations acknowledge that felines can spend more time by themselves than pooches, but the recommendation is still to keep it under eight hours.

Face masks in Spain now only required at hospitals, pharmacies & care homes

Face masks are no longer required on public transport in Spain, after the new rules were published in the Boletín Official del Estado (BOE). The health authorities still recommend 'responsible use' of face masks if people feel they have Covid-19 symptoms or have respiratory issues. Face masks will remain obligatory for visitors to hospitals

and pharmacies, as well as for care home staff and visitors, but not residents.

200 evacuated as fire engulfs migrant camp in Almería,

Some 200 people were evacuated from a camp housing hundreds of migrant workers in the Almería province of Andalusia, after a fire engulfed the site. Most of the camp's residents were men from sub-Saharan Africa and Morocco, working on the many farms in the area. Together with tourism, agriculture is a primary source of income for the region. The camp consisted of hundreds of huts built around 15 years ago and housed up to 500 migrant workers. Many shelters were built out of the same plastic used in the local farms' greenhouses and lack any services like electricity or running water.

Serves: 6

Ingredients:-

6 bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs Salt and freshly ground black pepper

1/4 cup olive oil

Cheesy Baked Leeks with Ham

Serves: 4

Ingredients:-

3 leeks (around 500g)

180g packet of sliced, cooked ham

30g butter

30g plain flour

150ml dry white wine

250ml milk

1 tbsp wholegrain mustard

1 tsp chopped fresh thyme leaves, plus a little extra to

75g grated cheddar

100g brie, sliced

Preparation:-

Heat the oven to 200°C /180°fan/gas 6. Cut the leeks into 8cm lengths, then wrap each in a piece of ham, cutting to fit and using up all the offcuts. Arrange in the base of a 1.5 litre ovenproof dish. Meanwhile, melt the butter in a pan, then stir in the flour and cook over a medium heat for 2-3 minutes. Gradually whisk in the wine and milk. Bring to the boil, then simmer for 3 minutes.

Stir in the wholegrain mustard, thyme leaves and cheddar until melted, then pour over the leeks. Top with the brie, then bake for

30 minutes until bubbling. Scatter with more thyme and serve with crusty bread.

Roasted Vegetable Yorkshire Pudding

Roasted Vegetable Yorkshire Pudding Traybake

Serves: 6

Ingredients:-

1 celeriac, trimmed and cut into 1cm wedges
6 medium shallots, peeled and halved lengthways
250g mushrooms, halved or quartered if large
A few fresh thyme sprigs
4 tbsp olive oil
Large handful kale, thickly sliced
2 fresh rosemary sprigs
Small handful fresh sage leaves
Pinch sea salt flakes
Quality veggie gravy to serve

For the batter:-

225g plain flour
Pinch baking powder
4 large eggs
300ml whole milk
3 tbsp creamed horseradish
2 fresh thyme sprigs, leaves picked

You'll also need... 1.5 litre baking dish or shallow casserole

Preparation:-

Heat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/gas 6. Put the celeriac, shallots, mushrooms and most of the thyme sprigs in a large roasting tin, drizzle with 2 tbsp of the oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Roast for 25 minutes, turning the vegetables halfway through, until tender and starting to caramelise. Drizzle the remaining 2 tbsp oil into the 1.5 litre baking dish, then warm in the oven for 5 minutes. Meanwhile, for the batter, sift the flour and baking powder into a large mixing bowl, then make a well in the centre. Crack in the eggs, then pour in the milk. Using a balloon whisk, beat to make a smooth batter (you should see bubbles start to appear on the surface). Whisk in the horseradish, thyme leaves and some salt and pepper. Sprinkle the kale into the warm oil in the baking dish/ casserole (see tip), then pour in the batter and arrange the roasted veg on top. Bake for 25-30 minutes until puffed up, golden and cooked through. Roughly chop the remaining thyme sprigs, along with the leaves from the rosemary sprigs and the sage leaves. Mix with the salt. Sprinkle over the pud to serve, along with a jug of piping hot gravy, some mustard and horseradish sauce.

Traditional Rice Pudding

Serves: 8

Ingredients:-

 $5\frac{1}{2}$ oz (150g) pudding rice 2 oz (50g) sugar

410g Carnation Evaporated Milk

Finally top with small blobs of butter and carefully transfer to the oven on the middle shelf for 2 ¼ hours.





ACUPUNCTURE AS TREATMENT OF **FIBROMYALGIA**



A study recently published in the Journal of Pain Research claims that acupuncture can decrease pain and improve quality of life in fibromyalgia patients.

Acupuncture May Ease Fibromyalgia Pain and Improve **Quality of Life**

Fibromyalgia is a disease characterized by widespread musculoskeletal pain and can affect up to 9.3% of the population. It is often accompanied by fatigue, sleep difficulties, cognitive dysfunction, depressed mood, or depressive episodes. This disorder occurs more frequently in middle-aged women, and is usually associated with a high

health cost, as well as that associated with loss of productivity. Management of fibromyalgia requires a multidimensional approach that includes patient education, behavioural therapy, exercise, and pain management. Unfortunately, no really effective treatments are currently available. The most common pharmacological therapies include amitriptyline, anticonvulsants, and serotonin and norepinephrine reuptake agents. However, recent European guidelines indicate that the effects of most treatments are relatively modest. Furthermore, they suggest that the initial management in the treatment of fibromyalgia should focus on non-pharmacological therapies.

Acupuncture Properties

Acupuncture is one of the most significant techniques within nonpharmacological therapies. Recent research shows how acupuncture works in the treatment of pain, since it can activate the pain control systems in the body (peripheral and central) releasing substances such as endogenous opioids, and non-opioid compounds such as beta-endorphins, enkephalins, dynorphins, serotonin, norepinephrine, gamma-aminobutyric acid and ATP. All these substances are essential to decrease hypersensitivity to pain and therefore reduce pain symptoms.

Study on acupuncture and fibromyalgia

The study consisted of a Systematic Review and Meta-analysis of clinical trials, for which 12 trials were used that compared the efficacy of real acupuncture with sham acupuncture

Study on acupuncture and fibromyalgia

The study consisted of a Systematic Review and Meta.analysis of clinical trials, for which 12 trials were used that compared the efficacy of real acupuncture with sham acupuncture or treatment with usual medication. Its conclusions state that real acupuncture showed better results than sham acupuncture and conventional medication in relieving pain and improving the quality of life of patients with fibromyalgia, both in the short and long term.

No serious adverse effects were found during acupuncture treatment. In summary, acupuncture is an effective and safe treatment for fibromyalgia patients, and can be recommended as a therapeutic option. However, more trials are needed to pinpoint the long-term effects of acupuncture on this disorder.

9 effects of stress on your body

Chronic stress can affect your whole body, from your head to your heart. Stress is a powerful thing. In small doses, it can motivate us to ace that presentation at work or land our dream job. But when left unchecked for a long time, stress is anything but motivating. So, what's really going on when you're stressed? And how can paying attention to your stress improve your health?

What is stress?

Whether you've just narrowly avoided a car accident or are worried about losing your job, stressful situations trigger a release of hormones known as the "fight-or-flight response."

The reaction starts in a part of your brain called the amygdala, which processes emotions like fear. When the amygdala senses danger, it sends a distress signal to your hypothalamus, which communicates to the rest of your body via the nervous system. When the hypothalamus gives the signal, your brain releases hormones like epinephrine (also called adrenaline) and the stress hormone cortisol into your bloodstream.

"The fight-or-flight response is a survival mechanism that lets us react quickly to dangerous situations by preparing to either fight or run from the stressor," explains Laura Keys Campbell, PhD, chief of outpatient psychology and therapy at Geisinger Medical Center in Danville.

Some physical signs your fight-or-flight response has kicked in include:

- Rapid breathing and heart rate
- Heightened senses and awareness
- Tense muscles
- Pale or flushed skin
- Cold or clammy hands
- Dilated pupils
- Dizziness
- Nausea

In a truly dangerous situation, this response can be lifesaving. But when stress is chronic and this system is activated too often, it takes a toll on your body.

How does stress affect the body?

Left unmanaged, stress impacts you physically, mentally and emotionally. "Research shows that chronic stress can have effects on almost every system in the body — from the heart to the digestive system to the immune system," Dr. Campbell says.

Here are nine effects of stress on your body:

1. Elevated blood pressure

It's normal for your blood pressure to temporarily spike when your fight-or-flight response is activated. But when stress becomes chronic, it could lead to long-term high blood pressure, which increases your risk of heart disease.

2. Weakened immune system

Do you feel like you always catch a cold after finishing a stressful project? It's probably because of cortisol's effect on your immune

"Cortisol temporarily inhibits your ability to fight off infections because it decreases your body's supply of white blood cells," explains Dr. Campbell. "This can make you more prone to catching illnesses like the cold or flu."

3. Chronic inflammation

But too much cortisol over a long period can also cause your immune system to overreact in the form of inflammation. "Inflammation is a critical part of the healing process as your body responds to intruders like viruses and bacteria," says Dr. Campbell. "But when no intruders are present and your body is still sending out inflammatory signals, it can lead to chronic inflammation." Chronic inflammation has been linked to several health conditions including: Arthritis, Diabetes, Heart disease, Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis and irritable bowel syndrome (IBS), Alzheimer's and dementia, Cancer.

"Going through periods of high stress doesn't automatically mean you'll develop one of these conditions, but it can put you at increased risk — or make symptoms worse if you already have

Is it bad to sleep near your Smartphone?

Is it bad to sleep near your Smartphone?

IF YOU'RE ANYTHING like the average mobile phone owner, you probably sleep with your smartphone within arm's reach. A recent report has found that 71% of people sleep with or near their phones, and that includes the 13% who said they slept with their phones in their beds. Maybe you've wondered whether keeping your phone nearby is a bad idea, perhaps it's zapping your brain with radio waves or otherwise harming your health. It would be comforting if researchers firmly and finally quashed any notions that our devices can cause negative health effects. No such luck. In November 2018, the U.S. government's National Toxicology Program wrapped up a 10 year, \$30 million study on the health effects of cellphone radiation exposure. In essence, the government scientists blasted rats with different levels of radio frequency radiation (RFR) for varying lengths of time and then watched to see what would happen. 'Our studies showed that radio frequency radiation at the frequencies and modulations used in cellular telecommunications and under the exposure conditions we used can produce adverse biological effects', says John Bucher, one of the study's authors and a senior scientist with the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. Specifically, Bucher's study found 'clear evidence' of tumours in the hearts of male rats exposed to RFR, as well as, 'some evidence' of tumours in the brains and adrenal glands of male rats. They found 'equivocal' evidence of adverse effects in female rats, meaning it wasn't clear if the tumours that turned up were caused by RFR exposure. What to make of these findings? Depends on who you ask. Bucher says his study was never intended to be the final word on the issue of cellphone radiation and human health. 'Were using this to put together follow-up research programs', he says. Even so, Bucher says there may be some 'low' risk when a phone is held against the head or body, like if you're on a call or keeping the phone in your pocket while using some kind of hands-free setup. He says these risks could go up with 'prolonged and persistent use'. though at this point, defining each of these terms is guesswork. 'If there is a risk, I think it's minimal', says Larry Junck, MD, a neurooncologist and professor of neurology at the University of

Michigan. 'We haven't seen an

increase in brain tumours since mobile phone use has become

widespread.' Moreover, Junck says the research showing any mechanistic link between cellphone radiation and brain tumours is inconsistent and 'methodologically flawed.' Others look at the existing research with great concern. 'I think there's compelling evidence that electromagnetic radiation exposure is indeed harmful,' says Joel Moskowitz, director of the Center for Family and Community Health at the University of California, Berkely. He reels off the findings of a dozen recent studies, including a 2017 review from China that found heavy mobile phone users were at significantly increased risk of glioma, a type of malignant tumour in the brain and spinal cord. A 2018 U.K. study found rates of glioblastoma, another cancerous brain tumour, more than doubled in England between 1995 and 2015. Specifically, frontal and temporal lobe tumours, locations that correspond with where we rest our phones during calls, showed some of the steepest increases. In a follow-up letter to the journal's editor, the authors of that U.K. study say they looked closely at the U.S. data on glioblastoma rates. After adjusting for post-2000 population changes, changes they say are not factored into the U.S. Central Brain Tumour Registry and other databases that track tumours, they turned up glioblastoma increases similar to the ones they tracked in England. Brain tumours aren't the only worry for cellphone users. 'If you look at modern smartphones, the antennas are in the corners, both upper and lower,' Moskowitz says. But the bulk of the cellular signal is now directed down through the lower antennas, 'which would make the most significant exposures in the neck area, 'he savs. Her mentions tumours of the neck and thyroid as particularly concerning. And there again, some data suggest rates are rising. Rates of thyroid cancer have tripled in the past three decades and

But none of these findings constitute proof that cellphones are to blame. For example. The ACS

(ACS)

are increasing more rapidly than any other type of

cancer, according to the American Cancer Society

Clinica Santa Cecilia

says the increased use of tumour detecting thyroid ultrasounds could explain the uptick in rates of those cancers.

'If there is a risk, I think it's minimal.' Why is it so hard to pin down the potential health effects of our devices? One gigantic hurdle is that the technologies these devices employ are constantly evolving, and the research on their health effects is often running a decade or two behind. 'Most of the epidemiological studies looking at brain tumour risk collected data in the early to mid 2000s from users whom used the old candy bar or flip phones, which were primarily using 1G or 2G cellular technology, 'Moskowitz says. Meanwhile, the telecom industry is now moving forward with 5G technologies, even though health experts still hardly have any data on 4G, he says.

Since this might keep you up at night, let's get back to the question of sleeping next to your phone. Moskowitz says tumour risks don't top his list of concerns, because a sleeper's phone isn't steadily transmitting the way it does during a call. But he says it's likely that low level night time radiation exposures could disrupt sleep and cause other neurological effects.

He points to a small 2016 study from Germany that found exposing men to cellphone radiation seemed to change the structure of their sleep, increasing or decreasing REM and other sleep parameters, though the health ramifications of these shifts aren't clear.

Whatever risks may exist could be heightened in

kids, 'I personally believe that children should be dissuaded from sleeping with a phone under the pillow, as RFR is thought to penetrate farther into their tissues than in adults,' Bucher says.

The obvious advice is to keep your phone out of the bedroom. Or, if you use it as an alarm clock, you could switch it into airplane mode, which stops it from sending or receiving signals, Moskowitz says. He also repeats the longstanding advice to use a wired handsfree device when making calls and to keep your phone away from your body. Start with all that and hope that the cellphone radiation Pollyannas turn out to be right.

something like arthritis or IBS," explains Dr. Campbell.

4. Headaches

Why does it always seem like a pounding headache strikes right when your frustration reaches its peak? "Because your muscles tense up during the fight-or-flight response, chronic stress can cause tension headaches or trigger migraines in people prone to them," says Dr. Campbell.

5. Anxiety, depression or mood changes

Beyond the physical effects, stress can also have a big impact on your mental health. "Studies have shown that unmanaged stress can trigger anxiety, depression, fatigue, difficulty concentrating and irritability," says Dr. Campbell. "It can also lead to unhealthy coping mechanisms like drug and alcohol abuse."

6. Weight gain

There's a reason why you reach for mac and cheese or cake whenever you're stressed. "Cortisol can cause cravings for foods rich in fat, sugar and salt. This is because our bodies are looking for quick doses of energy to prepare for whatever perceived threat we're facing," explains Dr. Campbell. Over time, reaching for these comfort foods during stressful situations could become an unhealthy habit leading to weight gain.

7. Difficulty sleeping

You're too stressed to sleep, so you stay up late. But then you're so tired that you feel even more stressed and stay up later the next night. Sound familiar?

"Stress and sleep can be a slippery slope," says Dr. Campbell. "Increased adrenaline and cortisol can make you feel too on edge to fall asleep and sleep deprivation can make you more likely to get stressed out."

8. Decreased sex drive

Wondering where your libido went? First consider how stressed you've been. "When we're going through periods of high stress, it's perfectly normal for sex to be the last thing on our minds," says Dr. Campbell. "This is typically only temporary and should resolve as you cope with the stress."

9. Changes to your menstrual cycle

If you've noticed your period is late, heavier or shorter than usual, it could be stress. "Because of chronic stress' effect on hormones, it could cause irregular menstrual cycles," explains Dr. Campbell. "You should always talk with your doctor about any changes in your period and be sure to mention if you've experienced any long-term stress lately."

Ways to relieve stress

So, how do you reduce stress once you have it? "It might be tempting to overeat, drink alcohol or use tobacco, but those things provide temporary relief at best, and only add to health problems in the long run," says Dr. Campbell.

Some healthier ways to relieve stress include: Exercise, Deep breathing, Meditation, Yoga, Getting enough sleep, Eating a healthy diet.

"Exercise is an especially great way to reduce or eliminate stress, boost your energy levels and improve your mood, not to mention your overall health,



They might also refer you to a licensed therapist or a professional counselor who can help you pinpoint and possibly eliminate sources of stress. Tuesday 14th March The Art of the Steal: Nazi Looting during WWII

The Nazis looted over 20% of Western Art during World War II, confiscating art from Jewish families and emptying museums throughout Europe. This lecture will provide an overview of Nazi looting by setting the scene in Nazi Germany, discussing Hitler's obsession with art and how the Monuments Men recovered art after the war. Several landmark cases will be discussed in detail, including Gustav Klimt's celebrated Portrait of Adele Bloch Bauer and the stash of over 1200 artworks found in possession of the son of a notorious Nazi dealer.



Her publications include articles for The Art Newspaper, The Times Literary Supplement and Art Quarterly. She is a contributor to the book Insiders/Outsiders: Refuges from Nazi Europe and their contribution to British Visual Culture. Shauna entertained in January 2020 with a talk on sensational art thefts.

What was the role of holy pilgrims and holy places on the pilgrimage to Santiago? A journey through art from the 10thc to modern times.

A fascinating story which will maybe inspire you to do the camino!

About Helen Sijsling - Dr Helen Sijsling MA (born in Australia, lived in the Netherlands, lives in Spain), MA History of Art (University of Leyden), MA English Literature (Universities of Leyden and Oxford) and MA Educational Management (University of Amsterdam). Helen taught English for the first part of her career to later become management consultant on education, advising secondary schools on educational improvement and training teachers and managers in The Netherlands and the Antilles. Helen is presently Chairman of The Arts Society Nerja and has lectured for many years to The Arts Societies in Europe.




