Holly as long been a symbol of eternal life and fertility. People believed that hanging the plant in their homes would bring good luck and protection all year round.

Christmas continued the Holly tradition from Druid, Celtic and Roman traditions, changing its symbolism to reflect Christian beliefs. Today Holly is a symbolic of Jesus Christ in

two ways; its red berriesrepresent the blood that Jesus shed on the cross, and the pointed leaves refer to the crown of thorns Jesus was

wearing when he died.

Which parts of a Christmas dinner can I give to my dog?

Providing your dog is healthy and is not allergic to the following foods, it's safe to feed your dog a little bit of these foods at Christmas:

- · Turkey meat (no skin and never give cooked bones)
- · Salmon (fillets or cooked in spring water are preferable to smoked salmon)
- · Lamb meat (no bones)
- Green beans
- Brussels sprouts
- Parsnips
- Carrot
- Peas Swede
- Mash potato (best without added butter)
- New potatoes
- Sweet potatoes

Toxic Christmas food for dogs

Christmas is the time for eating, drinking and being merry,

but lots of our favourite festive foods are toxic to our dogs and should be kept well out of paws reach:

- · Chocolate Chocolate contains a chemical called theobromine and when small amounts are consumed it can cause serious reactions such as agitation, tremors, convulsions, hyperexcitability and even heart problems. Interestingly, the darker the chocolate, the higher the levels of theobromine.
- · Christmas pudding and mince pies grapes and dried vine fruits, including currants, sultanas and raisins, can cause severe kidney failure
- · Onions (and garlic, leeks, shallots and chives) - these all belong to the allium species of plant and are poisonous to dogs whether cooked or uncooked. Avoid feeding foods that include these ingredients, such as gravy.
- · Alcohol alcohol has a similar effect in dogs as it does in their owners. Make sure your dog can't help themselves to any unattended alcohol left lying around.
- Macadamia nuts macadamia nuts can cause lethargy (tiredness), weakness in the back legs, increased body temperature, tremors and stiffness
- Leftovers don't be tempted to give your dog leftover Christmas food - they can include hidden ingredients toxic to dogs and mould in leftovers can make them ill
- Sweets many of the sweets we eat over Christmas contain a sugar-free sweetener called xylitol, which is poisonous to dogs

Dog proof your **Christmas tree**

Christmas trees can have hidden dangers for your four-legged friend - here's our top tips to keep your dog safe around the tree.

Keep decorations out of paws reach. Decorations such as baubles and tinsel can cause a dangerous stomach blockage if swallowed. Lots of them look just like a ball and can be very tempting to play with especially when you're not around!

Don't leave presents under the tree

Christmas presents lying under the tree can be too tempting for our dogs - especially if the gift is edible! It's best to keep wrapped gifts out of paws reach, as wrapping paper can cause a blockage in your dog's stomach if too much is eaten.

Keep fairy light cables tidy

The wires on fairy lights can be tempting for your dog to chew. Keep any cables out of your dog's reach and remember to switch them off at the mains when they're not in

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Duchess Potatoes

Serves: 8

Ingredients:-

750g potatoes, peeled, coarsely chopped

2 tbsp butter, melted

2 egg yolks

Pinch of white pepper

Melted butter, extra, to grease

2 egg yolks, extra

1 tbsp water

Fresh curly parsley, to serve

Salt, to season

Preparation:-

Place potato in a saucepan. Cover with cold water. Bring to the boil over high heat. Cook for 10 minutes or until very tender. Drain and return to the pan. Cook over high heat, shaking the pan, for 1 minute or until the moisture has evaporated. Use a potato masher to mash the potato until smooth. Use the



back of a spoon to press the potato through a fine sieve into a bowl. (Alternatively, use a mouli.) Stir in the butter and egg yolks. Season with salt and white pepper.

Preheat oven to 200°C. Brush a baking tray with extra butter to lightly grease. Line with non-stick baking paper.

Place the potato mixture in a piping bag fitted with a 1.5cm fluted nozzle. Pipe 16 rosettes onto the prepared tray.

Combine the extra egg yolks and water in a bowl. Brush over the potato rosettes. Bake in oven for 20 minutes or until lightly browned. Place on a serving platter. Top with a sprig of parsley to serve



Cranberry Turkey Meatloaf

Serves:-8

Ingredients:-

1 kg turkey mince

1 egg, lightly beaten

1 small brown onion, grated

1 granny smith apple, grated

2 garlic cloves, crushed

1/4 cup shredded fresh sage leaves

2 tbsp chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves

3/4 cup dried breadcrumbs

1/2 cup cranberry jelly, melted

Preparation:-

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Grease a 6cm-deep, 14cm x 21cm loaf pan. Line with baking paper, leaving a 5cm overhang at both long sides.

Using hands, combine turkey, egg, onion, apple, garlic, sage, parsley and breadcrumbs in a bowl. Press mixture into prepared pan.

Brush top with 2 tablespoons cranberry jelly. Bake for 1 hour or until cooked through. Stand in pan for 5 minutes. Using paper lining, remove from pan. Transfer to a platter. Brush with remaining jelly. Serve.



Christmas Ploughman's

Serves: 4

Ingredients:-

1 1/4 cups (200g) shredded cold cooked chicken or turkey

1 cup (180g) chopped ham

125g cream cheese

1 tbsp chopped chives

275ml chicken consomme*

2 gelatine leaves*

8 pink peppercorns*



Wedge of cheddar, to serve Chutney, to serve Watercress leaves, to serve Crusty bread, to serve

Preparation:-

Place chicken or turkey, ham, cream cheese, chives and 100ml consomme in a food processor, and process until smooth. Spoon into small serving dishes or 1 larger dish, then smooth the top. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate.

Place the remaining 175ml consomme in a saucepan over medium heat until just below simmering point. Meanwhile, soak the gelatine leaves in cold water for 5 minutes to soften, then squeeze out excess water. Remove consomme pan from the heat, add gelatine and stir to dissolve. Allow to cool slightly.

Uncover pate and press peppercorns onto surface, then cover with a thin layer of consomme mixture. Cover again and chill for 1 hour or until jelly is firm.

Serve the pate (it will keep in the fridge for 2-3 days) as part of a ploughman's lunch with cheddar, chutney, watercress and crusty bread.



Meringue Bombe

Serves: 8

Ingredients:-

1 x 350g pkt bought round apple teacake
1 x 1L ctn Vanilla Classic Ice-cream
3 egg whites
155g caster sugar
Cherry sauce:680g cherries
70g caster sugar
3 tsp cornflour

Preparation:-

Place the cake on a sheet of non-stick baking paper and use a pencil to trace around the cake to make a circle. Place paper on a baking tray pencil-side down.

Use scissors to cut the cardboard container away from the ice-cream, leaving the ice-cream in one piece. Transfer the ice-cream to a chopping board and cut into thick slices. Place the ice-cream slices on top of each other on the lined tray in the centre of the circle. Use the back of a spoon to mould ice-cream into a dome shape. Place in the freezer for 6 hours or until firm.

To make the cherry sauce, drain the cherries reserving 60ml (1/4 cup) of the juice. Place the cherries and sugar in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Combine the cornflour and reserved juice in a small bowl until smooth. Add to the saucepan and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until the mixture boils and thickens. Remove from heat. Set aside to cool slightly.

Meanwhile, preheat oven to 250°C. Carefully cut a 1cm-thick slice from the base of the cake to make a disc. Place the remaining cake on an ovenproof plate or baking tray. Top with ice-cream dome. Gently mould the 1cm-thick cake disc over the top of the ice-cream to cover. Place in the freezer for 30 minutes or until firm.

Use electric beaters to beat the egg whites in a clean, dry bowl until soft peaks form. Gradually add the sugar a little at a time, beating well after each addition until the sugar dissolves. Roughly spread the meringue all over the cake to cover completely.

Bake for 2 minutes or until it just golden. Serve immediately with warm cherry sauce.



Coffee Truffles

Makes: 20-25

200g good-quality dark chocolate, chopped 1/3 cup thickened cream 2 tsp instant coffee powder 1/4 cup chocolate sprinkles



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WHICH MATTRESSES ARE GOOD FOR YOUR BACK



Rest is something fundamental in people's daily lives, especially after a long day of work or the demands of everyday life, which is why choosing a good mattress to rest on will be important to improve sleep and in consequently improve physical, mental and emotional health.

What should the ideal mattress be like?

The answer to this question is quite difficult, since it is really you as a buyer who imposes these parameters adapted to your tastes and needs. however, based on different data we have been able to identify that some of the main characteristics for a perfect mattress can reach be:

- · Have an ideal surface, that is, one that is not completely hard, but not extremely soft either, something more in between.
- Have an uniform and homogeneous surface, in such a sense that the body of the person who uses it is completely level according to their build.
- Be ergonomic for the spine, having a surface with certain undulations and not completely flat

Taking this into consideration will be very helpful when choosing a mattress.

Benefits of sleeping well

Rest is a fundamental part of people's daily lives and, as mentioned above, it has a direct relationship with the state of physical health, since, while we sleep, our immune and nervous systems work to recover bodily functions correctly. To do this, during the night, body temperature, blood flow, blood pumping by the heart are reduced and, in turns, brain activities enter a state of "hibernation".

Because of these processes, when we look at someone who is wellrested, that person is operating at a different level than those who try to continue their day with one or two hours of sleep a night. Statistically, in spain people usually change their mattress every 12 years on average, which is a fairly high value compared to the 8 years recommended by the european association of bed manufacturers, therefore, it could be deduced that these years of difference can reach to influence people's physical health, altering not only the quality of sleep but also

posture and promoting the appearance of long-term musculoskeletal problems.

Achieving a restful sleep can be a difficult task for many people, therefore, investing in your quality of sleep will directly improve your daily performance, making you feel younger and more energetic to meet your daily goals.

What are the types of mattresses that exist?

Based on this, you must consider certain details that will help you identify which mattress best suits what you need, being able to identify the following:

- There are different sizes for mattresses (single, king, queen, etc.), which is why whether you usually sleep alone or with someone can influence this decision, also depending on how much space you like to have when sleeping.
- Your measurements must be taken into account, height, weight, etc. well, it is important that your entire body is inside the bed and you have enough space to sleep well.

The Vital Role of Iron for Women's Health: Beyond Anemia

Iron, often associated with its role in preventing anemia, plays a far more crucial role in women's health than one might imagine.

Beyond its contribution to red blood cell production, iron has been linked to various aspects of wellness, from combating fatigue and hair thinning to alleviating symptoms of restless leg syndrome (RLS). Recent studies have shed light on the importance of maintaining adequate iron levels, especially for nonanemic women with specific ferritin level thresholds.

Iron Deficiency: A Global and Local Challenge:

Iron deficiency isn't just a minor concern; it's the most common mineral deficiency worldwide, impacting approximately 20% of the global population. Iron deficiency anemia alone affects this large portion of the world. However, iron deficiency without anemia is even more widespread, indicating an urgent health issue. This challenge is certainly relevant to Australia.

The World Health Organization (WHO) estimates that in the land Down Under, 8% of preschool children, 12% of pregnant women, and 15% of non-pregnant women of reproductive age grapple with anemia, with iron deficiency serving as the major culprit.

Taking a Closer Look at Fatigue:

We've all experienced tiredness at some point, but persistent fatigue can have a substantial impact on a woman's daily life. A recent case study highlights the story of a 45-year-old woman who struggled with fatigue for six months. Despite normal

hemoglobin levels, her ferritin level was found to be as low as 35 mcg/mL, suggesting a possible iron deficiency. Studies like those by Verdon and colleagues emphasize the potential benefits of iron treatment for nonanemic women with ferritin levels below 50 mcg/L. Their research found that those who received iron experienced a significant reduction in fatigue scores, emphasizing the importance of maintaining optimal iron levels.

Unlocking the Connection with Hair Thinning:

Hair thinning can be distressing for many women. Surprisingly, iron deficiency may contribute to this concern. While research linking low ferritin levels to hair loss is established, the effectiveness of iron treatment has been debated.

A study by Hard et al. uncovered that among women with diffuse hair loss, 19% had iron deficiency without anemia. Strikingly, all patients who received iron treatment experienced hair regrowth. A ferritin goal exceeding 40 mcg/L is recommended to address hair thinning effectively.

This underscores the need for women with ferritin levels below 50 mcg/L to consider iron therapy as a possible solution.

Easing Restless Leg Syndrome (RLS):

Restless leg syndrome, characterized by

an irresistible urge to move the legs, can be disruptive to sleep and overall wellbeing.

Surprisingly, iron deficiency has been identified as a trigger for RLS.

Allen and colleagues have proposed clinical practice guidelines suggesting ferric carboxymaltose as an effective treatment for moderate to severe RLS in individuals with serum ferritin levels below 300 mcg/L.

Additionally, oral iron supplementation might be beneficial for those with ferritin levels less than 75 mcg/L.

The significance of iron in managing RLS cannot be underestimated, emphasizing the holistic impact of maintaining proper iron levels.

The significance of iron for women's health goes beyond its role in preventing anemia. Research has shown that iron deficiency, even in the absence of anemia, can contribute to fatigue, hair thinning, and restless leg syndrome.

Addressing these issues requires understanding the specific ferritin level

understanding the specific ferritin level thresholds: a ferritin level below 50 mcg/L for fatigue and hair thinning, and a ferritin level below 75 mcg/L for restless leg syndrome.

By recognizing and acting upon the importance of maintaining optimal iron levels, women can enhance their overall well-being and quality of life.

Iron is truly a crucial element that should not be overlooked.

Living a low-stress life


Being busy doesn't have to mean being stressed. The idea behind learning and practising relaxation techniques is that we understand how to manage and process the things going on in our day-to-day lives. It's important to remember that practising relaxation won't eliminate stress from your life. What it can do, is help fortify your response mechanism to stressful input. This means that you become more resilient in the face of situations which used to induce an intense mental and emotional response.

Managing fight-or-flight situations

Stressful situations induce our fight or flight response. This is our mind's way of saying act now or run away from the situation. In this situation, we likely feel anxiety, which can manifest via irregular and shallow breathing, sweaty palms and feelings of fear and worry amongst other symptoms. Whilst stress and anxiety are two very different things, one technique that's effective for managing both is to concentrate and focus on our breathing. One of the physical responses we have to a perceived threat is shallow and irregular breathing. When a panic inducing situation presents itself, stop what you're doing and take five deep, slow breaths. Breathe in for five beats, and out for five. Allow your chest to expand and your belly to rise as your lungs fill with air. At the end of the exhale, try making a 'shh' sound as you squeeze the last of the air out. 



Can ingredient really reduce wrinkles? Dermatologists weigh in



Even if you have a dedicated anti-aging routine, you still may notice fine lines and wrinkles popping up around your eyes or on your forehead. It's a natural part of getting older and nothing to be ashamed of, but still, when they start to appear, some of us might reach for serums and moisturizers promising to "smooth" or "reverse." They might even make some consider more invasive procedures like fillers or Botox.

But before you take that step, there's one ingredient making the rounds on TikTok that people say could be a needle- and pain-free way to stop wrinkles in their tracks. Argireline has been dubbed "Botox in a bottle" by some users. Products with argirline has been tested some of the users saying that it has helped improve the appearance of fine lines and wrinkles.

It sounds too good to be true, right? That's why we asked two top dermatologists whether the anti-aging ingredient lives up to the hype.

What is Argireline?

Argireline is a brand name for the peptide acetyl hexapeptide-3 or acetyl hexapeptide-8. Peptides are amino acids that help you make proteins, like collagen and elastin, so they're a common ingredient in beauty products, said Dr. Dendy Engelman, a board-certified dermatologist in New York City.

Similar to Botox, Argireline works by inhibiting your nerves' ability to release a signal to your muscles, therefore limiting the movements that lead to wrinkles, said Dr. Joshua Zeichner, director of cosmetic & clinical research in dermatology at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City.

For those who are needle-phobic or know that they're never going to go the Botox route, it's something that may be worth trying, especially considering that some of the options cost less than your go-to takeout order.

"Is it the Holy Grail of anti-aging? No," Engelman said.
"But is it worth a shot if you've got that in your budget,

and you're curious ... by all means, I think that's certainly feasible, and I wouldn't advise against it if they were my patient. But I also would want to temper the expectation that they're going to look 20 years younger."

If you want to give it a try, there are a number of formulas on the market that contain Argireline, and Engelman said that many of them have other beneficial additions, like other peptides and hydrating ingredients. It's one of the first topical ingredients that has been shown to have some effect on muscular contraction, Engelman added.

Does it work?

"Argireline is the closest ingredient that we have to Botox in cream," Zeichner said. "That being said, Argireline-containing creams do not come close to the effects that botulinum toxins actually provide themselves."

Wrinkles, like the crow's feet around your eyes or the vertical "11" lines on your forehead are caused by contractions from the muscles deep under the skin, he said. The injectable treatments that you'd receive at your dermatologist's office can be targeted specifically to the location and the depth needed to limit these contractions. With Argireline solutions that are applied on the skin, Zeichner said that it's questionable just how deeply the creams can penetrate, and that the efficacy can vary from person to person as well.

That being said, anecdotally and in select studies, there has been some evidence that it may work to improve the appearance of wrinkles.

There some results where people say that it diminishes wrinkles by ten to 30 percent, depending on the study you read.

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

The Art of Rabindranath Tagore

John Stevens PhD




About John Stevens


