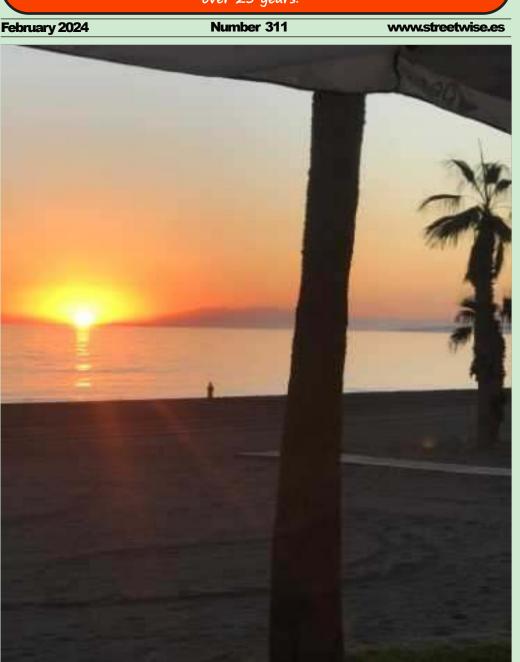

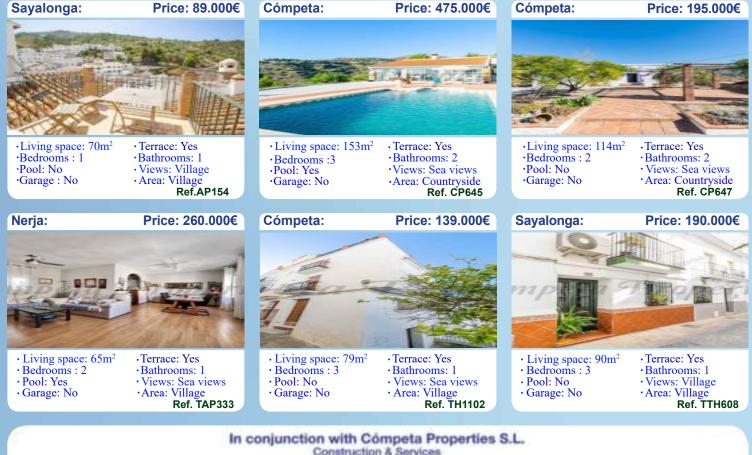

There are multiple services and discounts that card beneficiaries have at their disposal. The card is valid for five years from and the renewal process is automatic. The beneficiary will receive it by post without having to do anything. If it does not arrive, the Junta provides the free telephone number 900 2001 65 to report the problem. This same phone number can be called in case of loss, theft or any type of error on the card.

Head of Junta de Andalucía warns 30 days of rain are needed

Local councils need to spend more of their budgets on repairing supply pipes. The heavy rain seen earlier this week on the Costa del Sol and in Malaga province has failed to make an impact on the area's almost empty reservoirs, although for now it appears the levels have stabilised. Restrictions have tended to hit smaller towns in Malaga province. Fuengirola is the first larger town to cut back water pressure at night. Malaga province rainfall is average for January but more rain is needed to raise the water level in La Viñuela reservoir, the province's largest.

Extra virgin olive oil prices soar in Spain

Malaga farmers warn that the outlook for the countryside does not bode well for domestic economies.

The lack of rain points to another harvest failure, after the 2022-2023 season saw the shortest harvest in more than 20 years.

The start of this year saw price increases, with extra virgin olive oil approaching 13 euros per litre on many supermarket shelves. Alternatives below ten euros are becoming increasingly scarce and will gradually disappear. CORAXALIA

Many of us choose the beginning of the year to try and cut back, or stop drinking all together; and, for a lot of people a "Dry January" isn't a problem. However, there are those who will have found it difficult, or even impossible! Who despite promising a loved one they would reduce their alcohol consumption; maybe for health and financial reasons, or to save a relationship; they couldn't make it past the end of the first week, or even the first day.

What is the answer when you just can't seem to give up the booze? When the idea of going a day without alcohol terrifies you, never mind a whole month.

Millions of people worldwide, struggle with problems related to alcohol use. If you often drink more or for longer than you planned too; have tried to cut back (or stop) and found you couldn't; drink to deal with feelings and emotions; or if your drinking is interfering with your life - your responsibilities, relationships, finances, or health. Then you could have a problem with alcohol.

There is a solution, Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) is a 12 Step fellowship support group, that has helped people all over the world, with their problem drinking. If the consequences of your alcohol use are getting too much, if you are ready to stop drinking, or want support to help you try, then don't wait until it gets any worse.

Lizzie and Nate; two members of Alcoholics Anonymous who both started drinking in their early teens; talk about how following the suggestions given to them in AA, has changed their lives, for the better.

Lizzie - "I started drinking in my early teens, and it was superb! It made me feel like a grown up. My drinking was a problem from the very start. I first came to AA when I was 25 years old, following an assault, that was 100% the fault of alcohol. For the first 18 years, I would gain a period of sobriety, and then follow it with a relapse. Each relapse it got worse. The last time was horrific because my children saw me drunk and out of control, I felt like I was a monster in their eyes.

Since then, I have committed to the 12-step program, as was suggested to me, and as a result I have changed the way I think. I sometimes wish I had 'got it' the first time, but that was not my journey and there is a reason for that.

My life now is manageable. My ego is under control, in its box. I needed to change the way I thought, to enable me to be happy."

Nate - "My drinking got started when I was about 14. I was never able to make the equation that it was alcohol that was the cause of my problems. I had lost girlfriends, then wives! They had all pointed out that a big part of our relationship problems was that I did not drink normally. I lost my driver's licence because of driving drunk. I lost my friends because I beat them up whilst drunk. It was not until my current wife gave up on me, that I sought help in AA.

That was 10 years ago. By following the suggestions given freely to me, I know that I never have to drink again. To anyone struggling with alcohol, I would suggest finding a local AA meeting as soon as possible, we can't do this alone, we need help."

There are meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous, with friendly people who will understand, held daily throughout the Costa del Sol. Meetings are free to attend, and anyone who thinks they may have a problem with alcohol is welcome.

Saint Valentine

Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine, is celebrated annually on February 14th. It originated as a Christian feast day honouring a martyr named Valentine and through later folk traditions, it has also become a significant cultural, religious and commercial celebration of romance and love in many regions of the world.

There are a number of martyrdom stories associated with various Saint Valentines connected to February 14th, including an account of the imprisonment of Saint Valentine of Rome for ministering to Christians persecuted under the Roman Empire in the third century. According to an early tradition, Saint Valentine restored sight to the blind daughter of his jailer. Numerous later additions to the legend have better related it to the theme of love: tradition

maintains that Saint Valentine performed weddings for Christian soldiers who were forbidden to marry by the Roman emperor; an 18th-century embellishment to the legend claims he wrote the jailer's daughter a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell before his execution. The 8th-century Gelasian Sacramentary recorded the celebration of the Feast of Saint Valentine on February 14th.

The day became associated with romantic love in the 14th and 15th centuries when notions of courtly love flourished, apparently by association with the "lovebirds" of early spring. In 18th-century England, it grew into an occasion for couples to express their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. In the

Most of us are guilty of giving our dogs a taste of our dinner or sneaking them a little side treat from our snack, but is it really safe to feed our dogs table scraps? Short answer, yes and no.

There are many "human" foods that are healthy for your dog to eat. Dry kibble dog food was created to make it easier for us to feed our pets. In fact, many people feed their dog a raw food diet.

Healthy foods dogs CAN eat

There are actually many people foods that are healthy for our dogs. Raw and cooked food are all good to add extra nutrients to your dogs balanced diet.

Fruits and vegetables dogs CAN eat list

Many fruits and veggies are actually healthy for our dogs. In fact, I usually will freeze many of our fruits that are on the verge of becoming over-ripe. My dogs go crazy of these healthy treats!

• Apples: Vitamins A and C and fiber. Low in protein and fat.

• Avocados: Controversial. Beware the pit, skin, and leaves are toxic to dogs.

• Bananas: Potassium, vitamins, biotin, fibre, and copper.

• Blueberries: High in Antioxidants, fiber and phytochemicals.

• Broccoli: Vitamin C and fibre

• Brussel sprouts: Beware – the gassy effects of these vegetables are just as prevalent in dogs as they are in humans!

• Cantaloupe: High water content and fibre

• Carrots: High in fibre and betacarotene, which produces vitamin A.

• Celery: Vitamins A, B, and C.

· Cranberries: High in Antioxidants.

• Cucumbers: Vitamins B1, C, K, potassium, copper, magnesium, and biotin.

· Green beans: iron and vitamins.

• Mango: Vitamins A, B6, C, and E, potassium, beta-carotene and alpha carotene.

• Oranges: Vitamin C, potassium, and fibre



Peaches: Vitamin A and fibre

• Pears: Copper, vitamins C and K, and fibre

• Peas: Vitamins, A, C, K, iron and fibre

• Pineapple: High in Vitamin C and antioxidants.

• Potato: Vitamins C, B6, potassium and manganese.

• Watermelon: Vitamins A, B-6, and C, potassium. Plus, watermelon is

92% water, making it a great way to keep hydrated.

Can my dog eat cooked or raw meat?

Dogs are carnivores, so yes most meats are safe for your dog. You may even be one of the many dog owners that feed their dogs a raw meat diet (including me). However, it's important to note, that this is not as simple as giving your dog raw mince or chicken every day.

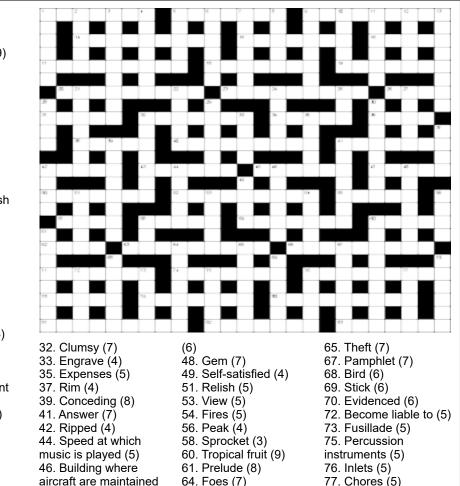

Red Velvet Heart Cookies

Serves: 46

Ingredients:-

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 ¹/₄ cup granutlated sugar
- 2 tbs unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 ¹/₂ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ tsp salt
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbs liquid red food colouring
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 ³/₄ cup all-purpose flour Powdered sugar

Preparation:-

In a large mixing bowl beat butter on medium to high 30 seconds. Add sugar, cocoa, baking powder, and salt. Beat until combined, scraping sides of bowl occasionally. Beat in eggs, food colouring, and vanilla until combined. Beat in as much of the flour as you can with the mixer. Stir in any remaining flour. Divide dough in half. Cover; chill



dough 1 hour or until easy to handle. Preheat oven to 375°F. On a floured surface roll half the dough at a time to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut dough using a 21/2- to 31/2-inch heart-shape cookie cutter. Place cut outs 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets. Bake 6 to 7 minutes or until edges are firm and bottoms are very light brown. Transfer cookies to wire racks to cool. Sprinkle with powdered sugar, using stencils if desired. Makes forty-six 21/2-inch or twenty-two 31/2-inch cookies.



Chicken Cassoulet with Spicy Chorizo and Smoked Bacon

Serves:-4

Ingredients:-

- $2\frac{1}{2}$ tbs extra virgin olive oil, plus extra to drizzle
- 4 x 400g chicken 2 dried spicy chorizo, cut into rough 1.5cm pieces 250g smoked bacon, cut into rough 1.5cm pieces
- 8 small eschalots, peeled, left whole
- 1 each large carrot & celery stalk, chopped
- 2 tsp each toasted cumin & caraway seeds
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ tbs each thyme, tarragon & flat-leaf parsley leaves,
- finely chopped 2 bay leaves

4 cups (1L) Chicken Style Liquid Stock 250g frozen broad beans, defrosted, peeled Toasted sourdough breadcrumbs, to serve

Preparation:-

If cooking in oven, preheat oven to 160°C. Heat a large heavy-based ovenproof saucepan with a lid over high heat. If using a slow cooker, select 'saute/sear' and preheat. Add the oil and sear chicken skin-side down (in batches if necessary), turning frequently, for 5-6 minutes or until deep golden and browned all over.

Transfer to a bowl. Add chorizo and bacon to pan or slow cooker and cook, stirring frequently, for 2-3 minutes until chorizo and bacon begin to brown.

Add vegetables, spices and herbs and cook, stirring, for 4-5 minutes until onion begins to soften. Stir in stock and bring to the boil. Season to taste.

Return chicken to the pan or slow cooker and push to submerge slightly.

If cooking in the oven, cover with lid and braise for 2 hours or until very tender. If using a slow cooker, cover with the lid, select 'slow cook' and set timer for 6 hours.

Remove lid and stir in broad beans.

Stand for 5 minutes to warm through broad beans. Season to taste.

Divide among bowls.

Spoon over a little cooking liquid and scatter with toasted sourdough breadcrumbs to serve.

Crab and Calamari Salad with Mixed Tomatoes

Serves:-2

Strain through a fine sieve, and discard solids, then whisk in vinegar. Season.

Fill a large bowl with ice and water. Place a saucepan of salted water over high heat and bring to the boil. Add the squid rings and cook for 10 seconds. Remove using a slotted spoon and plunge into iced water. Drain, then toss with crab, fennel and olives.

Slice remaining green tomatoes and arrange on a serving platter with vine-ripened and cherry tomatoes. Top with squid and crab mixture. Drizzle over green tomato dressing, scatter with basil leaves and season with black pepper.

Serves:-10

Ingredients:-

2 x 375g frozen Butter Puff Pastry sheets or alternative butter puff pastry sheets, thawed
250g caster sugar
3 eggs
1kg mascarpone
2 vanilla beans
2 x 250g punnets strawberries, hulled, larger ones halved

Preparation:-

Preheat the oven to 200°C. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.

Cut each pastry sheet into 10 rectangles and arrange in a single layer on trays. Cover with another sheet of baking paper and place another tray over the top to weigh down

the pastry while cooking. Bake, swapping trays halfway, for 35-40 minutes until golden. Remove from oven and transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Keep oven on. Meanwhile, place 200g caster sugar and 1 cup (250ml) water in a saucepan over medium heat, stirring until the sugar dissolves. Bring to 120°C on a sugar thermometer. Whisk eggs in a stand mixer until thick and pale. With the motor running, gradually pour hot sugar syrup into egg mixture in a thin, steady stream. 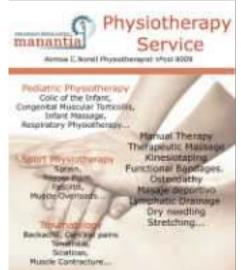

ACUPUNCTURE, MIGRAINE AND SCIENCE



A Systematic Review of scientific studies published in the Journal Neurology and Therapies shows that acupuncture is effective and safe in treating migraine

Migraine is a health problem that can disable the normal life of those who suffer from it, causing absences from work and class, as well as the inability to perform normal tasks and have an adequate social life. It affects 14.7% of the world population (chronically affecting 1.4% - 2.2%), with a higher prevalence in women between 18 and 49 years of age.

Some of the factors related to the appearance of migraine are the

abuse of medication for acute migraine, obesity, depression and as well as high levels of stress.

This disorder is related to an alteration of the pain modulator system in the body, in which there is a disruption of neural networks, in particular of the trigeminalvascular system. It can be associated with fatigue, concentration difficulties, nausea, irritability and present with moderate to severe throbbing pain, photophobia, and sonophobia.

Treatment for migraine in the first instance is usually pharmacological, consisting of NSAIDs, triptans, ergot alkaloids,



dopamine antagonists, corticosteroids, opioids, etc. Other non-drug treatments include neurostimulation on trigeminal, riboflavin, or coenzyme Q10.

Evidence for acupuncture

Various investigations show the efficacy of acupuncture in treating migraine headaches. A Cochrane Systematic Review reported in 2016 that acupuncture is a valid treatment option, since it reduces the duration and frequency of migraine, both episodic and chronic. Similarly, numerous studies have shown greater efficacy of real acupuncture compared to sham acupuncture or simulated acupuncture.

There is also evidence that the efficacy of acupuncture is not inferior to that of medications such as topiramate or propanolol. Acupuncture, therefore, is considered a safe therapy that can be helpful as an alternative in patients who do not respond to medication, or in a complementary way.

Acupuncture in the treatment of migraine is usually significantly effective after a minimum of sessions (usually between 6-8).

Scientific studies on acupuncture and migraine

The review shows up to 20 different scientific references where the role that acupuncture can play in the treatment of migraine is highlighted.

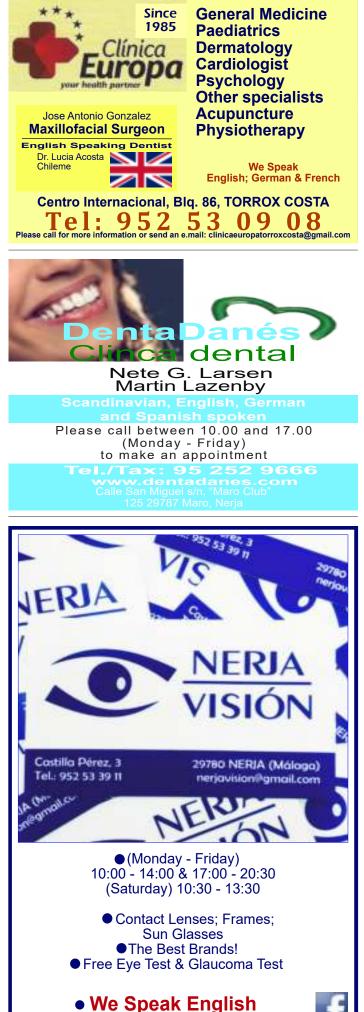
They explain various physiological mechanisms produced by acupuncture when treating this disorder, such as brain metabolic regulation and modulation of functional connectivity in the frontoparietal network. It also explains the beneficial effects of auriculotherapy, as well as electroacupuncture.

In conclusion

Acupuncture and its different techniques, such as auriculotherapy or electroacupuncture, can play an important role in the treatment of migraine headaches, being able to reduce the frequency, intensity and duration of attacks.

Longevity? You need a leg to stand on!

Flamingos everywhere have it right! A new study shows that the ability to stand on one leg for at least 10 seconds is strongly linked to the risk of death over the next 7 years. According to the findings, people in middle age and older who couldn't perform the 10-second standing test were nearly four times as likely to die of any cause — heart attacks, strokes, cancer, and more — in the coming years than those who could, well, stand the test of time. Claudio Gil Araújo, MD, PhD, research director of the Exercise Medicine Clinic-CLINIMEX in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, who led the study, called the results "awesome!"

"As a physician who has worked with cardiac patients for over four decades, I was very impressed in finding out that, for those between 51 and 75 years of age, it is riskier for survival to not complete the 10-second one-leg standing test than to have been diagnosed as having coronary artery disease or in being hypertensive" or having abnormal cholesterol, according to Araújo. Unlike aerobic fitness, muscle strength and flexibility, balance tends to be reasonably well preserved until the sixth decade of life, when it starts to wane relatively rapidly, noted the researchers in the study published in the British Journal of Sports Medicine.

The 10-second balance test "provides rapid and objective feedback for the patient and health professionals regarding static balance" and that the test "adds useful information regarding mortality risk in middle-aged and older men and women". Researchers have known for at least a half century that balance and mortality are connected. One reason is falls – according to the World Health Organisation, worldwide, more than 37 million falls each year require medical attention with nearly 700,000 people each year dying as a result of a fall.

Araújo and his colleagues have been working on ways to improve balance and strength as people age. In addition to the one-legged standing test, previously they connected the ability to rise from a sitting position on the floor as being a strong predictor of longevity.

For the new study, the researchers assessed 1702 people aged 51–75 years who had been participating in an ongoing exercise study that began there in 1994. Starting in 2008, the team introduced the standing test, which involves balancing on one leg and placing the other foot at

the back weight-bearing limb for support. People get three tries to maintain that posture for at least 10 seconds. Not surprisingly, the ability to perform the test dropped with age.

Although 20% of people in the study overall were unable to stand on one leg for 10 seconds, that figure rose to about 70% for those aged 76–80 years, and nearly 90% for those aged 81-85, according to the researchers. Of the two dozen 85-year-olds in the study, only two were able to complete the standing test. At roughly age 70, half of people could not complete the 10-second test. Over an average of 7 years of follow-up, 17.5% of people who could not manage the 10-second stand had died. compared with 4.5% of those who could last that long, the study found. After accounting for age and many other risk factors, such as diabetes, body mass index, and a history of heart disease, people who were unable to complete the standing test were 84% more likely to die from any cause over the study period than their peers with better one-legged static balance.

Although low aerobic fitness is a marker of poor health, much less attention has been paid to non aerobic fitness things like balance, flexibility, and muscle



strength and power.

"We are accumulating evidence that these three components of non aerobic physical fitness are potentially relevant for good health and even more relevant for survival in older subjects," Araújo said. Poor non-aerobic fitness, which is normally but not always associated with a sedentary lifestyle, "is the background of most cases of frailty, and being frail is strongly associated with a poor quality of life, less physical activity and exercise, and so on. It's a bad circle." Araújo's group has been using the standing test in their clinic for more than a dozen years and have seen gains in their patients, he said. "Patients are often unaware that they are unable to sustain 10 seconds standing one legged. After this simple evaluation, they are much more prone to engage in balance training," he said. I like to encourage my patients to fulfill their childhood fantasy of joining the circus. if you stand on one leg long enough, you might just be ready for the high wire act by your 100th birthday.

What is the 24-Hour Fast?

A 24 hour fast calls for abstaining from food and drinking only non-caloric beverages for a 24-hour period between meals. The 24 hour fast is often associated with the " Eat Stop Eat" intermittent fasting cadence that calls for abstaining from eating for 24 hours once or twice a week with two to five days between fasting periods.

Eat Stop Eat was developed by nutritional researcher Brad Pilon based on data from his studies at the University of Guelph. His findings were popularized in the popular book " Eat Stop Eat".

How to Do a 24 Hour Fast?

A 24 hour fast usually begins at sundown on the first day and ends at the same time the next day. Linking your fasting period with circulation rhythms takes advantage of innate metabolic processes in your body that are governed by natural light and dark cycles.

What Can I Drink on a 24 Hour Fast?

It's a given that you can't eat food during a 24 hour fasting period, but beverages can be a grey area. Most people stick with mineral water, while others drink black coffee or tea. A cup of black coffee contributes 2-3 calories, which isn't enough to interfere with the fasting metabolic state.

What Happens To Your Metabolism on a 24 Hour Fast?

After restricting calories for 12-36 hours of fasting your body will begin breaking down fatty acids. Concurrently, at the 16-18 hour mark, your body will activate a process of cellular repair and renewal called autophagy. But it's important to keep in mind that intermittent fasting only stimulates significant autophagy when you align your fasting period spans overnight.

24-Hour Fast Benefits

Now that you're familiar with the basics of a 24-hour fast, let's explore the various possible health benefits, including:-

The Glamour Years: Jewellery and fashion 1929-1959

Andrew Prince

In this talk which follows on from "Downton to Gatsby", Andrew shows how the Great Depression and the Second World war had such an extraordinary impact on fashion and jewellery design with the rise of Cinema and Hollywood.From the likes of Marlene Dietrich to Grace Kelly, he guides you through the various Screen Goddesses, how they were portrayed and what they gave to such dazzling effect.

He also shows that with the development of advertising, labour saving devices and leisure time, people had more opportunities to enjoy themselves and spend money on the finer things in life, as well as how the political events of the time influenced design and what was worn.

He also shows how The Belle Epoque and Art Deco styles did not end at the outbreak of the Second World War, but combined, to flower again with Christian Dior's "New Look"

About Andrew Prince

Andrew Prince has had a passion for jewellery since he was a small child. In fact his enthusiasm can be traced back to the time when, at the age of three, he swallowed one of his mother's pearl earrings having found her jewel box hidden from him in a cupboard. The very first piece of jewellery he created was a ring made of copper wire pulled from the back of a television. He presented it to his grandmother (it turned her finger green and gave her a rash). He then created a necklace for his mother using beads taken off her wedding dress (she was not at all happy).

In 1980, when he was nine, Andrew's mother took him to the Princely Magnificence exhibition at the V&A, exhibiting Renaissance jewels dating from 1500 to 1630. It proved a revelation.

Dazzled by the splendour and opulence of the jewels on show, Andrew decided then and there that creating jewellery was what he wanted to devote his life to. His passion for jewellery grew when, in 1984 on his first ever visit to Bond Street, Andrew viewed an exhibition by Castellani and Giulianoe at Wartski & Co's. While

there, he was allowed to handle beautiful 18th century gold boxes and magnificent imperial Russian pieces by Fabergé. In 1987, just before leaving school, he took time off to visit Geneva to view the astonishing Sotheby's auction of the Duchess of Windsor's jewellery collection. Here, for the first time, he held pieces created by some of the world's greatest jewellers, fashioned from only the finest of stones and set in designs of outstanding quality. For the young Andrew, it was a life-changing experience.

In August of that year, two weeks after his 16th birthday, Andrew started work in London's Bond Street, working for The Antiques Roadshow expert Ian Harris. Under his guidance, Andrew developed an appreciation for jewels that were valued for their quality of design and craftsmanship, rather than for how much the stones in the piece were worth. He then joined the renowned contemporary jeweller Elizabeth Gage and worked with her on the design and production side.

Through her and her private collection, Andrew was able to see and handle rare and extraordinary stones with names such as Sphene, Andalusite, Spinel and Dioptase, many of which are far rarer than diamonds. Elizabeth Gage was to have an enormous influence on Andrew's sense of what was possible within the realm of jewellery design.

Andrew's taste for fine 'costume jewellery' can be traced back to an antique market, where he came across a late Victorian brooch set with what he initially thought were emeralds and diamonds. They were, in fact, crystal and green glass set in silver and gold. He realised that beautiful jewellery didn't require expensive stones, and that it was the elegance of the design and the quality of the workmanship that truly mattered. Private commissions then started to trickle in.

The trickle turned into a flood, as celebrities such as Michael Jackson (a large crystal and pearl shoulder jewel) and Shirley Bassey (necklaces) were seen wearing Andrew's creations. In 2002, the V&A commissioned a collection of jewels to accompany the resplendent Tiaras, Past and Present exhibition which became one of their most popular exhibits.

The exposure gained by the show then led to Andrew's jewellery appearing in film.

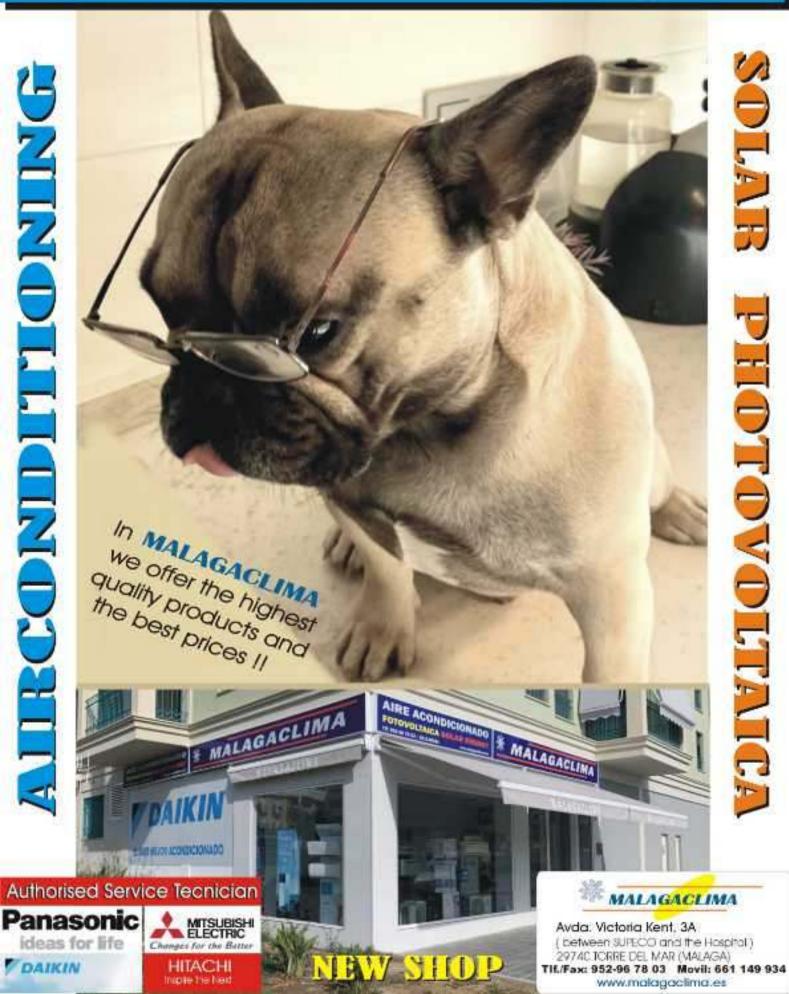
