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

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

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Galeria Luz de la Vida, the ART place in Competa! 10 Year Anniversary!



Galeria Luz de la Vida, the ART place in Competa! Calle Laberinto 15 bajo Competa, (opposite Restaurant El Pilon), Only accesable by stairs.

This year the gallery celebrates its 10th Anniversary with extra events and activities. Competa has been a place for artists and art lovers for decades now, if not longer. This September Month it's THE place to be if you like to see art and to meet artists! We've the yearly Art Walk that takes place from 13th till the 15th.

In the days before that weekend we host talented young artist Osama Rytami as an artist-in-residence in the gallery. He is a conceptual artist of Moroccan roots who grew up in Italy and studied in Milano. He has had solo exhibitions in Germany and in France. He has a number of faithful collectors worldwide (such as in the USA, in Germany, France, Italy, Spain, Latin America), who count on his bright future in the art-scene.

Statement of the artist:

"My art is inspired by nature elements, most of all by light and the symbols of the universe, as well as by science of ancient languages with its codes and keys. By it I express my longing for knowledge and spiritual sensuality. It is my

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pleasure to exhibit my works in the spirit of the beautiful Andalusian habitat of Cómpeta in the bright light of its white architecture surrounded by pure nature."

Rytami loves to recycle materials and to work intuitively. From Thursday the 5th till Tuesday the 10th of September he will be at work in the atelier/ gallery. You're very welcome to meet him and to see him creating from 11:00 to 14:00 and from 17:00 to 20:00. And Sept 12th to 16th (hours 11:00 to 14:00 and 16:00 to 19:00), he exhibits at Casa Edita, Calle Toledo 22, Cómpeta during and after the Art Walk.

The gallery has a history with International artists from all over the world. For the Art Symposium Luz artists travelled to Competa to join the vibrant creative weeks. Since these were public events about creation, it brought a lot of dynamics and interaction in the village. In October, the 17th - 24th of October, we'll have our 6th Symposium LUZ! This time it takes place in the Natural Park near Competa with the inauguration Thursday the 24th in the gallery.

During the Art Walk the gallery will open its doors as well, we're open from Thursday 12th September till Sunday 15th September from 11:00 - 14:00 & 16:00 - 20:00. We'll present lasercut art works by Dutch artist Lieuwke Loth, Re-circle deco art objects by the collective consisting of Han Renting & Lieuwke Loth, ceramics by Swiss artist Anne-Barbara Lenzin, paintings by Spanish artist Javier Montero and of course in our stock we have paintings of good quality by our International Symposia artists. 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

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Dog Socialisation Is Important

It should be perfectly natural for a dog to be able to communicate with other dogs, but more and more dogs are lacking the essential skills they need to interact appropriately with other members of their own species; in fact, this is one of the most common issues I am asked to help with, and it causes more problems than just an awkward or embarrassing walk.

As far as I can see, it is a problem that has been caused mostly by a recent decline in dogs being allowed to exercise off lead. This has come about due to:

- dogs being banned from exercising off lead in popular areas,
- personal fear of what your big dog might do to that little one or fear of what another bigger dog might do to your tiny pooch, and
- a lazy approach to dog training.

Playtime Is Not Just for Fun

Playtime is an essential part of a dog's routine, not just because it's fun (although that is important), but mostly because dogs use playtime to practice some of their most essential survival skills, such as communicating, hunting and fighting.

Of course, we could play with our dogs ourselves, and many of us do so regularly - it is one of the many joys of owning a dog. This is great for bonding and can help them practice in some capacity, but it is never going to be as good to chase you as it will be to play chase another dog; we are so much slower and weaker than another dog, so play has to be diluted, mostly to avoid injury to ourselves.

Chasing, tugging and wrestling with another dog can be rougher and faster than we do it; it allows the dog to really let themselves go. If he doesn't get the chance to let loose with another dog, you might struggle with inappropriate or rough play behaviour at home, such as play biting, grabbing at hands or clothing and stealing valued items to instigate an unwanted chase or a tug game.

Regularly exercising his need to play and interact with dogs will also make your dog less reactive when he is on his lead, as they will have already fulfilled this need adequately, and at an appropriate time.

How Is Socialising Good for Your Dog's Mental Health?

Interacting with other members of his own species can only be good for your dog's mental health. It will help boost self-esteem, and allow your dog to behave like a proper dog. This is particularly important these days, when dogs are often being treated less and less like actual dogs and more like little people. We are all guilty of it!

It Provides Mental Stimulation

Playing with old friends is great, but meeting new dogs on neutral territory and learning how to interact with them is particularly beneficial to your dog's mental health as it stimulates the problem-solving and investigative parts of his brain, which fulfills another of his psychological needs.

How to Socialise Your Dog Safely

How you introduce your dog to other dogs mostly depends on how trustworthy he is in their presence. If your dog is overly excitable on his lead in the presence of other dogs, then it is likely he will be much calmer off his lead than on.

The constriction of the lead often causes frustration and anxiety, and it can be helpful to let dogs meet on loose leads, or even better no leads at all (though context is key, here). Frustration comes because he is trapped and forced to meet another dog nose to nose, which is very rude behaviour for a dog. The dog is anxious because when things go wrong, and is more likely to choose a flight reaction, but in this scenario, he is restricted to a freeze or fight response only.

At Dog School, we have lots of options where you can allow your dog to meet and socialise with other dogs in a safe and controlled way. One of those is regular Playtime sessions which are organised according to both size and play style. Chicken Ceasar Salad

Ingredients:-

3 slices bread, torn into bite-sized pieces

Olive oil spray

4 slices prosciutto, excess fat trimmed

400g Chicken Breast Fillets

2 baby cos lettuce, trimmed, leaves separated, coarsely



½ cup fresh continental parsley leaves

2 hard-boiled eggs, peeled, quartered

1 tbsp finely grated parmesan

125ml (1/2 cup) 99% fat free ceasar dressing

Preparation:-

Preheat oven to 200°C. Line 2 baking trays with non-stick baking paper. Place bread on 1 tray. Spray lightly with oil. Place prosciutto on the remaining tray. Bake, turning bread once, for 7-8 minutes or until the bread and prosciutto are crisp and golden. Set aside to cool.

Meanwhile, spray a non-stick frying pan with oil. Heat over medium-high heat. Cook the chicken for 4-5 minutes each side or until golden and cooked through. Set aside to cool slightly. Thinly slice.

Break the prosciutto into shards. Combine the bread, prosciutto, chicken, lettuce, parsley, egg and parmesan in a serving bowl. Drizzle over the dressing.



Thai Beef Salad

Thai Beef Salad

Ingredients:-

1 ½ tbsp fresh lime juice

1 garlic clove, crushed

1 tbsp finely chopped palm sugar

1 tbsp fish sauce

2 tsp sesame oil

1 tsp soy sauce

2 tsp finely grated fresh ginger

700g beef rump steak

1 x 200g pkt grape tomatoes, quartered

1 cucumber, halved lengthways, thinly sliced diagonally

1 red onion, halved, cut into thin wedges

2 long fresh red chillies, halved, deseeded, thinly sliced lengthways

1 bunch fresh mint, leaves picked, large leaves torn

1 bunch fresh coriander, leaves picked

1 bunch fresh Thai basil, leaves picked, large leaves torn 55g toasted peanuts, coarsely chopped

Preparation:-

Whisk together lime juice, garlic, fish sauce, sesame oil, soy sauce, ginger and palm sugar in a jug. Place the steak in a glass or ceramic dish. Drizzle with half the dressing. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge, turning occasionally, for 2 hours to develop the flavours. Preheat a barbecue grill or chargrill pan on high. Cook

Preheat a barbecue grill or chargrill pan on high. Cook steak on grill for 2-3 minutes each side for medium or until cooked to your liking. Transfer to a plate. Cover with foil and set aside for 10 minutes to rest.

Place the tomato, cucumber, onion, chilli, mint, coriander, basil, peanuts and lime leaves in a large bowl. Thinly slice steak across the grain and add to the salad.

Drizzle with remaining dressing and gently toss to combine.

Divide salad among bowls and serve immediately.



Pumpkin and Spinach Salad

Pumpkin and Spinach Salad

Ingredients:-

600g butternut pumpkin, deseeded, peeled, cut into wedges

- 2 tsp olive oil
- 2 tsp honey
- 2 tsp sesame seeds
- 1 thsp fresh lemon juice
- 1 tbsp honey, extra
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tsp wholegrain mustard
- 1 x 150g pkt baby spinach leaves
- 1 x 75g pkt toasted pine nuts

Preparation:-

Preheat oven to 220°C. Line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper. Place the pumpkin in a large bowl. Drizzle with oil and honey.

Season with salt and pepper. Gently toss until the pumpkin is well coated. Place in a single layer on the lined tray. Bake, turning once during cooking, for 25 minutes or until golden brown.

Remove from oven and sprinkle evenly with the sesame seeds. Return to oven and bake for 5 minutes or until the seeds are lightly toasted.

Remove from oven and set aside for 30 minutes to cool. Combine the lemon juice, extra virgin olive oil, mustard and extra honey in a screw-top jar and shake until well combined.

Season with salt and pepper.

Place the pumpkin, spinach and pine nuts in a large bowl. Drizzle with the dressing and gently toss until just combined. Serve immediately.

Prawn Mango and Avocado Salad

Ingredients:-

1kg cooked tiger prawns

2 mangos, cut into 2cm cubes

2 avocados, cut into 2cm cubes

2 limes, plus lime wedges to serve

½ cup finely chopped coriander leaves

1 long red chilli, seeds removed, finely chopped

1 tbsp avocado oil or extra virgin olive oil

1 lettuce, leaves separated





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IMPORTANCE OF STRETCHING



People who practice sports tend to be more aware of the importance of stretching, but it is common to find people who stretch inappropriately. For this reason I am going to explain the reasons why we should do it, what the correct way is and when we should do it.

Consequences of good stretching work in sports

Any sport is based on the functioning of the skeletal muscle system and more specifically the muscular or myofascial system, so if its length and mechanical functioning are not optimal, this will have a negative impact on sports performance and marks obtained.

And the fact is that the muscles are authentic motorized pistons that largely base their ability to generate force on the path they are capable of taking from their maximum length to that of greatest shortening or contraction, that is, when the muscle stretches it charges an energy that discharge with muscle contraction and subsequent movement. This is why complete, intense, longlasting and frequent muscle stretching work will often lead to a moment of sporting performance and improved marks achieved. On the other hand, muscular imbalances between the left side and the right side or between the back and the front will generate not only a decrease in sports performance but greater mechanical suffering of all

you to suffering from all types of

interosseous, which will predispose

injuries, tendonitis, muscle tears, etc.

- Reduces muscle tension.
- Increases amplitude and coordination of movements.
- · Prevents future injuries.
- Prepares the muscles for physical activity in this case ballistic stretches are more indicated since they will not misinform the mechanoreceptors and will leave the muscle prepared to respond to a very large or sudden stretch.
- · Improves knowledge of one's own body.
- · Improves circulation.
- Helps reabsorb lactic acid, preventing muscle fatigue.
- We achieve physical and therefore psychological wellbeing.

How to stretch?

When we stretch a muscle, what we are doing is distancing the two insertion points of it, that is, the purpose is to separate the ends of the muscle so that its fibers stretch. To do this, one of these points must remain fixed and we will vary the amplitude on the moving point. We must respect a series of principles when stretching:

- We must respect the planes and axes in addition to the joint width.
- We have to place the muscle in a state of pre-stretch and make the tensioning slow and progressive.
- It should not hurt, we should notice some tension but it should be tolerable.
- During the stretch we must breathe deeply and regularly.
- · Respect stretching times.
- Progressive tensioning up to maximum tension.
- Maintain maximum tension for approximately 20 seconds.
- Return to the initial position slowly and progressively.
- Rest time: the sum of the time spent in the 3 previous steps.

When to stretch?

As a reference we can point out that it is not essential to stretch before or after regular training, but it is simply important to stretch at some point. This can be when we wake up, before going to bed, or during breaks at work. We must keep in mind that stretching or flexibility exercises should be part of our daily life.

Athletes

You should always stretch before and after exercise. It is more advisable to do ballistic stretches before practicing sports and leave static stretches for afterwards. But it is true that there is great controversy regarding this issue. During the warm-up it is recommended to work on the mobility of the joints most involved and stretch the muscles most involved in the sport we practice. After the activity, it is recommended to stretch to reduce tone, promote circulation and eliminate lactic acid. During physical activity, when we perform an activity in series of series where breaks are taken, they are indicated to avoid loss of elasticity and facilitate muscle recovery.

Non-Athletes

Even if you do not do any sporting activity, it is advisable to dedicate a few minutes a day to stretching as a preventative measure. The ideal would be to stretch at the workplace, just before starting the workday, especially in jobs that involve repetitive movements or postures held for long periods of time. In this way we are warming up the muscles and preparing them for the day and thus we



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will be avoiding a possible contracture or injury. Workers should emphasize the areas that are under tension during their work hours. So people who work sitting should place greater emphasis on the upper back, neck and shoulders, or people who work standing should emphasize the lumbar, hamstrings and calves.

In conclusion, comment that it will be important to perform the stretches, both symmetrically and globally to have global elasticity of the entire musculoskeletal system, and to perform certain stretches asymmetrically to obtain compensation, for example when the left hamstrings are shorter than the rights hamstrings, or a right psoas that is shorter than the left.

General conclusions

Correct stretching in sports is of vital importance, since it allows better muscle function, reducing muscle tension, preparing the muscles for physical activity (stretching before exercise) and helping the reabsorption of lactic acid (stretching after exercise). exercise) thus avoiding muscle fatigue; Therefore, good stretching translates into an increase in sports performance. In addition, stretching prevents muscle imbalances that could cause injuries such as: tears, tendonitis, among others.

Likewise, stretching is not reserved only for athletes; nonathletes can stretch as a preventative measure. Those people who work for hours with postures held for long periods of time generate great body tension, which is why a stretching routine before and after work is very beneficial.

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Antibiotic Guardians

WE ARE FACING A global catastrophic threat as more and more bacteria becomes resistant leaving us with more and more untreatable infections. While over the last 30 years, we have discovered at least one new infectious disease, very few new antibiotics have been developed leaving our pharmaceutical armoury almost empty as bacteria evolve and become resistant.

European Antibiotic Awareness Day is held in November, an annual European public health initiative, to raise awareness about the threat to public health of antibiotic resistance and prudent antibiotic use. The latest data confirms that across the European Union the number of patients infected by resistant bacteria is increasing and that antibiotic resistance is a major threat to public health. Before the discovery of antibiotics, thousands of people died from bacterial diseases, such as pneumonia or infection following surgery. Antibiotics were once considered 'wonder drugs' efficiently fighting diseases from pneumonia, diarrhea, ear and sinus infections. Since antibiotics have been discovered and used, more and more bacteria, which were originally susceptible, have become resistant and developed numerous different means of fighting against antibiotics. Because resistance is increasing and few new antibiotics have been discovered and marketed in recent years, the problem of antibiotic resistance is now a major public health threat. Yesterday's wonder drugs have become not so wonderful in face of new super bacteria ironically mutated through the misuse of antibiotics. Data from the European

Data from the European
Antimicrobial Resistance
Surveillance Network
(EARS_Net) show that there I
s a North-South gradient with

low rates of resistance in Scandinavian countries and the Netherlands and high resistance rates in Southern Europe. Countries with lower resistance rates have generally lower use of antibiotics, whereas countries with higher antibiotic resistance rates use more antibiotics. For those who live here full time or part time, you should be aware that amongst western countries, Spain has one of the highest rates of antimicrobial

consumption, and antimicrobial resistance. Embarrassingly, it is the medical profession that is most culpable for the inappropriate use of antibiotics. Studies indicate that nearly 50% of antimicrobial use in hospitals is unnecessary or inappropriate. Some doctors may not have kept up to date on the latest protocols for the right use of antibiotics. Other doctors write out prescriptions to 'be safe'. In August 2018, I was interviewed by the BBC as to proposals by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence, NICE, to sanction doctors who are 'soft touches' for antibiotic prescriptions. During the BBC interview, I pointed out and continue to maintain that patient demands put pressure on doctors to prescribe antibiotics even though they are ineffective for their infections. Almost everyday I am asked for antibiotics for viral infections, such as a cold, cough, flu or most bronchitis. It would be easier to write out the prescription than face the frustration and, sometimes, anger when I explain that antibiotics are not going to make them feel better, make then less contagious or cure their viral infections. In fact, each time a person takes antibiotics, sensitive bacteria are killed, but the resistant germs are left to



grow, mutate and multiply. Repeated, inappropriate use of antibiotics will jeopardize the effectiveness of essential drugs leaving you more vulnerable to the life-threatening super bacterias.

Hospitals, clinics and your own doctor's surgery are great breeding areas for microbes! Viruses and bacterias are spread from patient to patient in airborne molecules and through physical contact. Medical professionals may forget to wash their hands or change gloves between patients! Hygiene is one of the most important factors in preventing the spread of contagious infections. Antibiotics are needed when your doctor diagnoses you with an infection caused by a bacteria. Lab tests are essential to make a good diagnosis.

A sore throat caused by Streptococcus A can not be definitively diagnosed by simply looking at the throat, no matter how much redness and pus there is. Acute bronchitis, or chest cold, occurs when the bronchial tubes leading

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to the lungs become inflamed. This usually follows an upper respiratory infection like a cold. Antibiotics are rarely required in acute bronchitis as it is almost always viral in origin - no matter how green and gooky the sputum you are coughing up. Acute rhinosinusitis had been traditionally treated with antibiotics, however a study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association in December 2007 found that antibiotics were ineffective in treating the majority of these infections. Antibiotic therapy should be reserved for acute rhinosinusitis patients meeting specific criteria and then should be narrow-spectrum agents targeting the most likely pathogens such as Streptococcus pneumoniae or Haemophilus influenzae.

Preventing an infection is easier than treating one. No antibiotic or other medication is as effective as practising good hand hygiene.

Keep your immune system healthy with a vitamin-rich, low fat diet. Reduce environmental risk factors by not smoking and avoiding second-hand smoke.

Ingredients:-


1 cup thinly sliced carrot rounds

Add all ingredients to the blender, adding the liquids first. Blend until smooth. Eat immediately or store up to 1 day refrigerated in a covered jar.





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

When is the time to question your relationship with alcohol?

The summer holidays are almost over. Autumn is just around the corner. Before we know it, the kids will be back at school. Summer on the Costa del Sol can feel like one long party: Trips to the beach, dinners out, night-time clubbing, and nonstop fun – all with a side order of alcohol.

Maybe this hasn't been your experience of summer. Instead, you've been sitting at home, drinking on your own. Fear of embarrassing yourself with drunken out-of-control behaviour has you drinking alone, and lonely.

Has your drinking become an issue for you, or those around you? Are friends and family commenting on how much, or how often you are drinking? Is your alcohol use damaging your relationships, finances, or health? Is your life, and your drinking, out of control and unmanageable?

Do you think the time has come for you to take a look at your relationship with alcohol?

You are not alone. Millions of people worldwide have admitted defeat in their quest to try and control, or manage, their problem drinking. They found a solution that works; Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) - a 12 Step, peer-support fellowship group. Here two members talk about how their drinking brought them to AA.

"My name is Gaby. I was 12 years old when I started experimenting with alcohol and drugs. For the next 21 years I would constantly put myself in dangerous situations, experience horrific consequences, suffer horrendously through the aftermath, and then do it all over again. Three years ago, I decided things had to change. I followed the advice of someone I liked into a meeting of AA. I stayed because I suddenly didn't feel so alone. I met others like me.

In my first meeting I was angry and in denial. I was also drunk. I wanted to test all the people in the room. How could these calm, well-dressed people know

anything about what I had been through? They were gentle and ready for the myriad of questions I threw at them. I was genuinely moved by their kindness. I wanted to be kind like them. I wanted what they had. That was three and a half years ago and so much has changed. I got a good sponsor. I did what she suggested, and I kept coming back. And a miracle happened. I changed and began to heal."

"My name is Tom. I had numerous run-ins with the law, lost my career, and most of my family and friends; and still, I couldn't see my part in the problem. I finally realised I needed to do something about my drinking, when my physical health seriously deteriorated. But really, by this point, my mental health was broken so badly, I knew the game was up. I'd heard of AA through my last counsellor, an addiction specialist. He begged me to go to along to a meeting. He actually said it would be pointless to continue with our sessions unless I went to AA. As it turns out he was right, AA and the 12 Steps totally changed my life, and the lives of those who were still around me. I went to my first meeting in March 2020, and since that day I haven't picked up a drink or drug."

There are meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous, with friendly people who understand, held daily throughout the Costa del Sol. If you are ready to stop drinking, or want support to help you try, then get in touch.

Meetings are free to attend, and anyone who thinks they may have a problem with alcohol is welcome.

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

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


