



'We are in danger' -

Spanish anti-tourism spills into winter season!

It's well past the August holiday peak, but anger against over-tourism in Spain is spilling into the off-season, as holiday-makers continue to seek winter sun.

During November anti-tourism protesters will gather in Seville.

This year appears to have marked a watershed for attitudes to tourism in Spain and many other parts of Europe, as the post-Covid travel boom has seen the industry equal and often surpass records set before the pandemic. Spain is expected to receive more than 90 million foreign visitors by the end of the year. The consultancy firm Braintrust estimates that the number of arrivals will rise to 115 million by 2040, well ahead of the current world leader, France.

This year's protests began in April, in the Canary Islands, and included a hunger strike by six protesters in Tenerife in an attempt to halt two major tourism projects on the island. They continued in many of the country's most popular tourist destinations, such as the Balearic Islands, the

Mediterranean city of Alicante, cities on the southern coast and Barcelona, where some protesters squirted foreign visitors with water pistols and shouted: "Tourists go home!". The grievances driving the upcoming protests are similar to those in the summer.

The complaint about tourism's impact on rental rates is a common theme and feeds into a broader housing crisis across Spain. The country's central bank has reported that nearly half of families who rent at market prices are at risk of poverty or social exclusion. However, with tourism



representing 13% of Spain's GDP and directly providing around three million jobs, its supporters insist that the industry is essential to the economy and that it drove the country's recovery in the wake of the pandemic. They are particularly concerned by scenes such as that on Playa de las Américas in Tenerife on October 20th , where one video showed two tourists sunbathing on the beach while protesters chanted just metres away from them. There have also been reports in the Spanish media of more hostile behaviour, such as the locks of tourist apartments in Seville being covered in faeces. Such incidents prompted David Morales, head of tourism for the conservative People's Party (PP) in the Canary Islands, to insist on "the right of tourists to enjoy their holidays without being the target of interruptions or gestural or verbal attacks, and certainly not physical attacks".

As the protests continue beyond the summer, there are particular concerns in destinations like the Canary Islands, where the climate means they receive large numbers of visitors during the winter months. The president of the Circle of Impresarios and Professionals in Southern Tenerife (CEST), Javier Cabrera, warned that "under an umbrella of legitimate grievances, tourism-phobia is being cultivated". There has been an attempt to defuse the backlash, with a range of measures being implemented. Barcelona city hall has announced that short-term tourist apartments will be banned from 2028. Local authorities in Palma de Mallorca have put a cap on the number of cruise liners which can dock in its port. In Tenerife, a new limit has been introduced on the number of visitors to some natural parks. And in Seville, a new charge is planned for those entering the city's popular Plaza de España square. Yet Asier Basurto is not convinced and says the protests must continue. "Those who advocate tourism can no longer say that everything is rosy," he said. "Either we change this now or it's going to be too late."

Boredom busters for your dog!

As the weather starts to fees more and more unpredictable these days, sometimes it simply doesn't allow you to exercise your dog as much as you (and they!) would like. Here are some boredom busters to help you keep them entertained.

1. Use trash (literally!) for enrichment

You're already recycling, right? Good for you! You can use recyclables as DIY puzzle toys for your dog, an indoor activity that will both enrich and preoccupy them.

My own dogs love tearing up cardboard boxes and sometimes even forget about the treats inside because they love the activity itself so much.

Here are some ideas you can do:

• Cardboard boxes: put a treat inside it, fold it up, and let your dog go crazy.

• Plastic bottles: drop a couple of treats inside a plastic bottle.

• Empty toilet paper rolls: put a couple of treats inside the roll, fold up the ends, and hand it over!

• Egg cartons: put a couple of treats in an egg carton and close it. Let your dog figure it out.

• Old towels: lay it flat, throw some treats in the middle, then roll it up into a pretzel. Your pup will do the rest.

2. Nose/sniffing games for your dog

You don't need a scenthound to have fun with nose games! You can start with easy games and work up to some really complicated stuff if your dog enjoys it. Shell Game: Grab three cups, put a treat under one, and ask your dog 'which one?'. When they sniff the right one, praise, and lift the cup and let them have their reward. When they are confidently finding it, start moving the cups around before asking "which one?"

Which Hand? Put both hands behind your back, and put a treat in one hand. Offer both closed fists to your dog and ask them 'which one?'.

Find-It: This is a great game to get your dog using their nose and brain to search for something, which provides mental and physical stimulation and strengthens their independence.

For beginners, toss a treat on the ground just a few feet away and say "find it!" Repeat. Once your dog gets the concept, here's how you advance it: ask your dog to sit or lie down and then ask them to stay. Place the treat or smelly toy somewhere only slightly hidden (like just around the corner where they can see you). Release them from their stay as you say 'Find it!', and allow them to search for the treat or toy until they find it. Slowly increase the difficulty of the hiding spot and soon you'll use your entire house/apartment for this game! If your dog gives up and sits next to you for longer than 30-45 seconds, you can help them by standing closer to the treat or toy.

3. Practice those training behaviours! You can freshen up on some known behaviours, or you can teach your dog something brand new! Use a treat pouch filled with some small, yummy treats and have an idea of what you want to train. Stay positive and keep training light, without pressure. Remember, it isn't important to get perfect behaviour in one session, the goal is to have fun and work together.

taking an existing know n behaviour and adding to it. For example, if your dog is really good at lying down on cue, add lying

on their side, or even roll over! Give lots of breaks and celebrate small wins!

4. Use puzzle toys

We are lucky to be living during a time when so many advancements in the dog toy industry are being made! Most pet supply stores carry at least a few puzzle toys and of course, you can buy pretty much anything you want online! Our favourites are from Nina Ottoson or Outward Hound. There are difficulty levels, so you can find what is right for your dog.

5. Play

Play with your dog. Play with your dog. One more time, for the people in the back: PLAY WITH YOUR DOG! The only requirements here are:

• You have to be silly.

• It has to be consensual. Maybe play looks like dance for you and your dog. Maybe it's rolling around on the floor like hooligans. Maybe toys are a necessary component. Maybe it involves



lots of running or no running at all. Be silly, pretend you are five years old. Use silly voices. Pretend. Use your imagination. Reconnect with your inner child and your dog at the same time. I promise, just a bit of play every day will enhance your relationship with your dog and keep you both busy!





Pea and Broccoli Korma

Pea and Broccoli Korma

Serves:-3

Ingredients:-

2 tbsp olive oil, Extra Virgin
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 piece, 2-inch ginger root, mined or grated
½ red pepper
Thai chili pepper, finely diced
Green onion, chopped
1 medium red bell pepper, cut into strips
2 broccoli heads, raw, chopped into florets
250 gm cherry Tomatoes, quartered
1 tsp cumin seeds
1 can (13.5oz) coconut milk, reduced fat



- 1 can 16 oz diced tomatoes, low sodium, canned
- 1 tbsp maple syrup, pure
- 2 tbsp curry powder
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black pepper
- 200 gm green peas, raw (canned or frozen)

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil over high. In a large Dutch oven or other heavy lidded pot, heat 2 tablespoons of the oil over medium-high. Add half of the eggplant, season with salt and pepper and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened and lightly golden, 5 minutes. Transfer eggplant to a plate. Adjust heat to medium and repeat with 2 tablespoons of the oil and the remaining eggplant, transferring the eggplant to the plate. Add the remaining 2 tablespoons oil and the mushrooms to the pot. Season with salt and pepper and cook, stirring occasionally to scrape up any browned bits, until golden, 5 minutes. Add onion and carrot, season with salt and pepper and cook, stirring occasionally, until onion is softened, 3 minutes. Adjust heat to low, add garlic and tomato paste and stir until caramelized, about 2 minutes. Stir in broth, tomatoes, oregano, basil sprig and the browned eggplant, then bring to a boil over medium-high. Cover, adjust heat to medium and cook, stirring occasionally, until eggplant is very tender, 15 minutes. Uncover and cook, stirring and mashing half of the eggplant, until sauce is thickened, 2 minutes. While the sauce comes to a boil, drop pasta in the boiling water and cook according to package directions until al dente. Reserve 1 cup of the pasta water before draining. Add pasta, butter and 1/2 cup of the pasta water to the eggplant mixture and cook, stirring vigorously, until pasta is nicely coated and mixture is saucy, 2 to 3 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Divide pasta among bowls. Top with chopped basil and cheese; serve warm.

Ginger Carrot Cake with Cream Cheese Frosting

Serves:-

Ingredients:-

¹/₂ pound grated carrots 1 inch fresh ginger 1/4 cup unsalted butter ¹/₂ cup granulated sugar 3 ounces light brown sugar vegetable oil large eggs 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract $1\frac{1}{4}$ cup flour 1 tsp baking soda 1 tsp ground cinnamon 1/2 tsp table salt 1/4 tsp allspice optional ¹/₄ tsp ground nutmeg 1/4 tsp ground ginger 1/8 tsp ground cloves 1/4 cup chopped nuts, such as pecans or walnuts optional

Cream Cheese Frosting:-

4 ounces full fat cream cheese 2 tbsp unsalted butter room temp ¹/₂ tsp vanilla extract ¹/₄ tsp around ainger 2 cups powdered sugar 2 tbsp chopped crystalized ginger optional

Preparation:-

Peel the carrots. Grate the carrots finely using the smallest holes on a box grater. Measure out 1/2 pound (8 ounces), or about 1 cup grated carrot and set aside. Use the same sized holes or a small microplane to grate the fresh ginger. Measure out 2 tsp of grated ginger. Set aside.

Preheat the oven to 350F. Grease an 8 x 8-inch metal baking pan with butter. Place a square of parchment paper in the base of the pan for easy cake removal. In a mixing bowl, use a hand mixer on low speed or a mixing spoon to mix together the softened butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar, and oil until well combined. Mix in the eggs and vanilla extract until just combined. Stir in the dry ingredients: flour, baking soda, cinnamon, salt, optional allspice, nutmeg, dry ginger, cloves, and 2 tsp grated ginger. Once combined, fold in the grated carrots and optional nuts. Transfer the cake batter to the prepared 8 x 8-inch pan. Bake at 350F for 25 to 35 minutes. Check the cake for doneness starting at 25 minutes (be careful not to slam the oven door or shake the cake pan.) When the cake is done, it should be slightly domed on the top, the edges will be golden and pulling away from the pan, and the centre should spring back went touched gently. Let the cake cool for no more than 10 minutes before gently removing from the pan and turning out on a cooling rack. Once cooled completely, top with the cream cheese frosting and optional pecans. Enjoy!

Cream Cheese Frosting:-


The cream cheese and butter should be room temperature/ softened for this step. Use a hand mixer to cream together the cream cheese and butter until light and fluffy, about 30 seconds. Stir in the vanilla, ground ginger, and half of the powdered sugar. Continue mixing on low speed. Once the powdered sugar is incorporated, add in the remaining 1 cup. The cream cheese frosting should be thick but easily spreadable. Add a splash of milk if it is too thick, or add additional powdered sugar 1/4 cup at a time if it is too thin. Fold in the diced crystalized ginger making sure it's distributed evenly into the frosting. Spread on the cake and enjoy!



Acupuncture treatment of knee osteoarthritis



Urinary Tract Infections – Complicated and Uncomplicated



Urinary tract infection (UTI) is the most common of all bacterial infections and can occur at any time in the life of an individual. The urinary system is designed to keep out microscopic invaders and generally does a pretty good job at it – but sometimes the defences fail. About 95% of the time bacteria multiplies at the opening of the urethra and travels up to the bladder. Even then, when bacteria is introduced into the bladder, there are a number of defence systems



protecting the urinary tract against an active infection. Some of these defences include:

Urine is normally sterile and itself works as an antiseptic, washing out bacteria during normal urination.

Ureters work to prevent urine from backing up into the kidney when the bladder forces out the urine through the urethra.

The bladder's mucous lining has antibacterial substances that eliminate many pathologic organisms.

The prostate gland secretes infection fighting substances in men. A healthy women

has lactobacilli in the vagina, which maintains an acidic low pH environment that is hostile to other bacteria. Still sometimes bacteria manages to enter despite the body's various defences and a urinary tract infection ensues. Less frequently but more seriously, the bacteria spreads and infects the kidney causing pyelonephritis. Urinary tract infections are not treated alike depending if they are classified as complicated or uncomplicated. Uncomplicated UTI's are usually found in nonpregnant, premenopausal women. Complicated UTI's are defined variably but generally include patients with underlying disease such as diabetes, postmenopausal women. pregnancy, alcoholism,

men, structural

There is a significant difference in the treatment of complicated and uncomplicated UTIs. T oo often I am seeing patients who fall in the complicated category given antibiotics regimen suitable for an uncomplicated infection. I usually see these patients in a significant level of They tell distress. me tales of weeks of on-going treatment with changing antibiotics all resulting in no cure for their pain and discomfort.

From diagnosing to treatment, there is a difference in what is effective for complicated and uncomplicated UTIs.

Uncomplicated UTIs

The popular and quick "dipstick" to test urine is acceptable for pre menopausal women with an uncomplicated presentation (no fever or kidney pain). The optimal duration of treatment in these cases is three days. Single-dose therapies have an unacceptable rate for the infection to come back mutated and nastier! If these patients are still symptomatic after three days, they require a laboratory urinalysis along with a microbacterial culture to identify the causative organism.

Numerous studies have shown that it is not acceptable to simply change the antibiotic with out having that culture!

Complicated UTIs

Pretty much everybody else with UTIs fall into the complicated category of infection and need their first urine sample sent for biochemistry and culture in a lab as well as a dipstick at the doctor's surgery.

Why not just use the "dipstick"? Not for these more complicated infections. The main disadvantage of the dipstick is that, while "instant", the information may not be very accurate. Additionally, the information given in dipstick testing is pretty limited as the dipstick is a qualitative test rather than a quantitative one - it does not give a precise measurement of the quantity of the abnormality. Therefore, dipstick urine results do not show both normal and abnormal values.

The ability of the dipstick to replace microscopy is an ongoing controversy. Many studies, including those presented to the American Academy of Emergency Medicine, show that a negative dipstick test simply cannot be counted on to rule out pyruia - pus in the urine.

Post menopausal women need laboratory urinalysis and gynaecological evaluation with ultrasound are needed.

Antibiotics in complicated UTIs need to be taken for ten to fourteen days.

Urinary tract infections in all men, as a general rule, are considered complicated infections and the possibility of the infection having ascended to the kidney or having ascended from the prostate must be considered. Laboratory urinalysis, microbacterial culture and specialist urological consultation are required.



Is the lust for likes on social media encouraging people to take life-threatening risks? Chris Stokel-Walker pokes his lens over the precipice

It was an ordinary day in Wolverhampton, a small city in the English Midlands, in December 2017, right up to the point that Jay Swingler's head got stuck in the microwave. Swingler, a popular You Tuber known for his goofy behaviour, has inserted a plastic tube into his mouth, slipped a green plastic shopping bag over his head and then cemented himself into a microwave using Polyfilla, a type of plaster normally used to fill small holes. The plaster expanded more than expected and, crucially, Swingler allowed it to set. When he tried to loosen the microwave, it wouldn't budge. The fire department had to drill him free as paramedics stood by in case of injury.

Though the stunt went wrong, it propelled Swingler to a new level of stardom. Before posting the video, Swingler was gaining roughly 10,000 subscribers every three days; in the three days following the posting, he attracted 70,000 new subscribers. His video was viewed 850,000 times within 13 hours of going online.

Daredevil behaviour in pursuits of likes, retweets and shares does not always have such a soft landing. The number of self-inflicted injuries and fatalities in the name of attention seeking is growing between 2014 and 2018 more than 200 people worldwide died while taking a selfie. In October 2018, Jon James, a Canadian rapper, fell to his death while filming himself on an aeroplane wing. Joanne Orlando, a researcher in technology and learning at Western Sydney University, blames the mechanics of social media which prize constant validation from others. Since people are more likely to comment on dynamic selfies than static ones, many are reluctant to upload anything that looks too ordinary. Algorithms on many platforms reinforce that tendency. If a particular pose or shot proves popular, then it is served up to more people. Other users, seeing it's success, may try to match or outdo the stunt in order to be rewarded by that same process. Mona Kasra, a professor of digital media at the University of Virginia, recently travelled to Iceland, where locals reported a spate of tourists placing themselves in harms way while trying to capture breath taking photos on the lips of volcanoes. "They're not equipped and don't know how to deal with that environment," she says. Smartphone cameras can take pictures of near professional quality, but they also have limitations that may encourage dangerous behaviour. Digital zooms produce blurry images, and the field of view in phone camera lenses is often narrow. Trying to get the best shot, some people shuffle closer to precipitous edges in order to capture more of the backdrop behind them. In October 2018, a couple died after falling off a cliff in Yosemite as they perched for a shot. That is not as unusual as it should be. Of the 200 plus deaths by selfie between 2014 and 2018, some two thirds of deaths involved great heights, water or a combination of the two. An app for smartphone cameras that identifies potential hazards and flags up locations identified as dangerous by previous users is available.

Phones are not the only devices to encourage risk taking. The GoPro camera can be fixed onto a person's head to allow participants in extreme sports to capture dramatic, first person footage. Runners and cyclists use gamified fitness apps such as Strava to compete with each other and receive online 'badges' as reward for accomplishments. These can prompt an individual to take a more dangerous route down a mountainside, for example, in order to reach the top of an online leader board. "We are very amenable to manipulation by reward even if it puts us in danger," says Adam Johnson, a behavioural scientist at the University of Bath. His colleague, Lukasz Piwek, is more circumspect about causation. But a forthcoming paper written by the pair shows that cyclists who use Strava are very speedy, a fifth



of users pedal at more than 22mph, and the fastest are most likely to pay for the app. The trend is global, Los Angeles County Sheriffs have reported a 38% increase in rescue missions since 2013 as more and more people end up in trouble while trying to capture the perfect photo or video. In 2017 British emergency services were called out to more than 3,000 incidents that had associated field notes which mentioned YouTube, nearly double the number of such calls in 2013. In an extreme case in America in the same year, Pedro Ruiz III, a young YouTuber, died when his girlfriend, Monalisa Perez, shot him at close range under the mistaken belief that a hardback book he was holding could stop a 50 calibre bullet.

India is on the front line of selfie fervour: over half of the selfie related deaths recorded since 2014 occurred there. The country's ministry of railways now warns people to avoid taking selfies on the tracks; and Mumbai's police force has identified 16 hotspots in the city where selfie takers could put themselves in danger.

Many selfie takers are conscious of the dangers. In the early days of January 2017, Viki Odintcova, a 23 year old Russian model, lowered herself off abeam at the top of the Cayan Tower, a 1,004 foot edifice in Dubai. Eyes closed, she leaned into thin air as she clung onto the hand of an assistant who was all that stood between her and a sharp fall into the waters below. She then opened her eyes so that her assistant could take her photo with his free hand. The photo went viral, but she deleted it from her Instagram profile after a backlash from followers who believed that it would encourage others to repeat her prank. The two videos that remain on Instagram documenting the stunt



have been viewed more than 3.2m times. But Odintcova says she is no longer proud of her daring. "I was just trying to leave a trace inn history." Some platforms have responded by age blocking content that might encourage minors to undertake copycat stunts. YouTube quickly barred younger registered viewers from watching Swingler's video, for example. But such measures are crude and are easily bypassed. Some platforms exist with the specific purpose of hosting material excluded by mainstream sites. One such site, LiveLeak, gets 36m hits a month.

And so the proliferation of outlandish stunts continues. Social networks keep promoting extreme content, and their users are unlikely to start favouring mundanities in sufficient numbers to divert the algorithms along a safer course. Beware the wisdom of crowds!
